ONLINE

Early College courses are taught year-round online and are available to students 24/7.

ON CAMPUS

Summer on campus classes are also available.

Eligibility and Options

High school students nationwide with a 3.0+ cumulative high school GPA may apply anytime from the spring of their sophomore year through the fall of their senior year. Apply anytime at uaearlycollege.ua.edu. Upon acceptance, new student and parent participate in a Gateway Session, offered on campus or online.

Students may earn from two up to 30 hours of college credit. Students decide when to take classes (fall, spring, and/or summer). Courses may count as dual credit/dual enrollment.

Students who complete at least 18 hours through UA Early College with a 2.5+ GPA are eligible for admission to The University of Alabama without submitting ACT/SAT test scores and will receive priority in selecting on-campus housing. Also, UA Early College credit transfers broadly to most colleges and universities.

Academics

Courses are taught in a vibrant online environment, including video, podcasts, discussion boards, chat and Wimba sessions, wikis and group projects. Course content is available to the student 24 hours a day/7 days a week.

Courses meet general education requirements in Humanities, Computer Science, Language, Social and Behavioral Sciences, Fine Arts, Math, Natural Sciences, History, English Composition, and Literature.

Students earn two hours of college credit when they pass UAEC 200. UAEC 200 is a pre-requisite Gateway class to freshman-level courses offered through UA Early College.

Students are encouraged to take the most rigorous high school curriculum available to them and expand their academic options through UA Early College.

Support

Peer coaches, current UA students, serve as mentors to Early College students. Academic advisors assist students in determining appropriate courses for enrollment. Professors and instructors are SACS accredited and offer student-centered instruction. Student and parents are surrounded by an active network of support from the Early College staff.

Early College students receive the academic benefits afforded all UA students, including online and on-campus access to UA Libraries, Center for Teaching and Learning, the Writing Center, and Office of Disability Services.

Financial

Students taking Early College courses may be eligible for a partial Early College tuition scholarship. Please call 1-877-823-8759 to determine specific scholarship eligibility.
