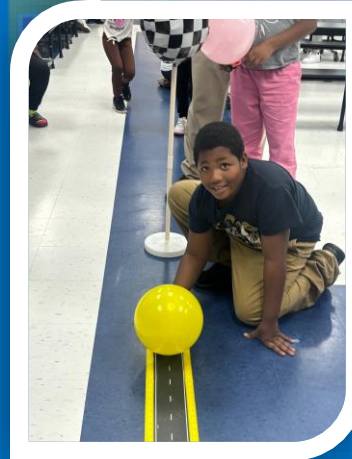

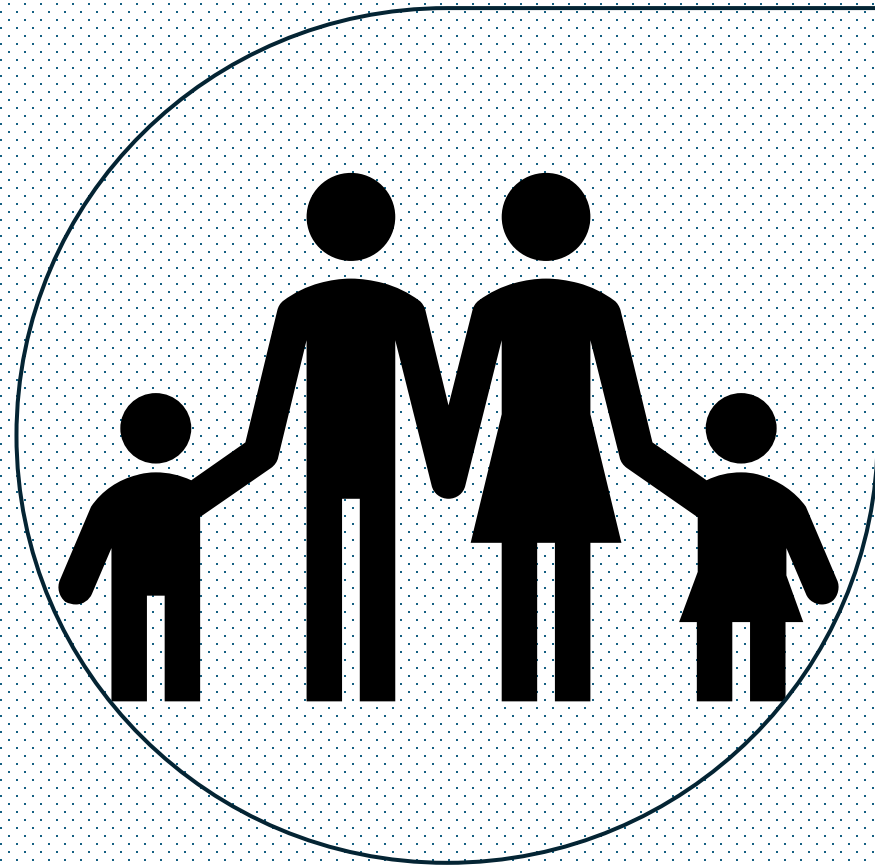

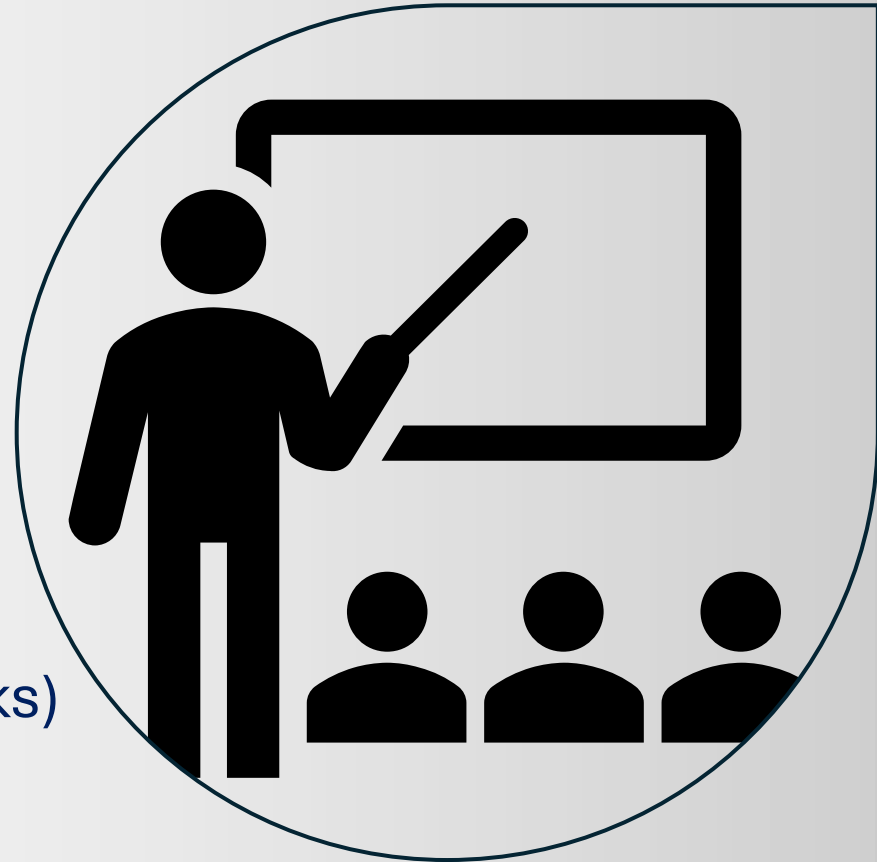

2024-2025 District Goals

2024-2025 School Goals

- Increase the percentage of students reading on Grade Level by 10%; measured by GMAS and HCLI.
- Increase the percentage of students performing on or above Grade Level in Math by 10%; measured by MAP & GMAS.
- Increase percentage of students performing at the Proficient Learners Level on the GMAS in ELA, Math, Science and Social Studies from 25% to 35%.

Parkwood will

- Provide families appropriate grade level reading texts for individual students to improve fluency and questions to ask to improve comprehension.
- Provide families with a monthly newsletter listing current standards taught in the classroom.
- Conduct a Parent Academic Event focusing on comprehension strategies, decoding skills, and word study.

Family will

- Listen to their child read every day for at least 20 minutes and ask questions provided by the teacher.
- Read, review, and discuss monthly newsletters listing current standards taught with their student.
- Attend Academic Events focusing on comprehension strategies, decoding skills, and word study.

Student will

- Read from the reading texts for at least 20 minutes to their parents and answer questions provided.
- Discuss, review, and practice current standards being taught in the classroom.
- Give parents flyers, newsletters, and all other correspondents.
- Remind their parents about the Academic Events and Activities.
