    - ♦ Intermediate College Algebra MTH 1105
- ♦ Good attendance
- ♦ Good discipline/conduct
- Overall Good Standing with their school
- Submit <u>completed</u> academy Application
- Review of transcript
- Recommendations
  - One (1) administrator
  - Three (3) teachers (two must be core academic)
- Write an essay explaining why you would be an excellent candidate for one of our academies.
