- 2. Discussion/Evaluation of 2023-24 programs
 - a. Title I, II, IV Economically disadvantaged students. Mrs. Shackelford reports on Lohn ISD as a Title I school-wide campus. All title money (I, II, and IV) is REAPed, and is primarily used for teacher pay and some instructional supports.
 - b. Parent Involvement Program The Lohn Booster Club is a strong supporter of the school and parents are encouraged to offer support through the Booster Club. Mr. Skees discussed some of the athletic opportunities that are available for students and parents, such as Lohn Youth Sports. Lohn Youth Sports focuses on basketball and track activities. Mrs. Rabenaldt reports that the Lohn Educational Enrichment Foundation (LEEF) has donated track equipment for the school that will be of benefit for the Lohn Youth Sports group in the future.

Mrs. Rabenaldt also reports on plans for parent involvement opportunities in the coming year that will include opportunities for parents to participate in academic (after hours) activities as well as the regularly scheduled academic activities. Activities will include UIL academic, Ag and FFA related activities, and possibly others.

- c. Wellness Program This program focuses on healthy eating and physical activities for students. This group does not need to take action on the policy, but we would like input on changes for the plan in the coming year.
- 3. Discussion concerning Comprehensive Needs Assessment and the Campus Improvement





Lohn ISD:
