Academic District goals

- ✓ The percentage of students at Proficient or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessment will increase by three percentage points.
- ✓ The percentage of students at Proficient or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) Mathematics End of Grade Assessment will increase by three percentage points.

School goals and focus areas

TMS will focus on improving Math by showing .9 months of growth on the STAR Math. This will be accomplished by improving areas of focus in 6th grade number sense, 7th grade understanding of operations with rational numbers, and 8th grade defining/evaluating/comparing functions.

TMS will focus on improving by:

- Teachers will implement Desmos Math & IXL online program to remediate and accelerated students
- Teachers will offer tutoring during one of their planning periods to work with students for remediation or acceleration
