In general, students will continue to receive traditional grades (A, B, C, etc.) for all of their **core classes** during the spring semester of 2020. However, students and families with extenuating circumstances may request moving to a Pass/Fail grading system for **one or more of the core classes** during this semester. Teachers and counselors may also recommend that a student move to the Pass/Fail grading system, and we will work with parents to ensure it is an appropriate accommodation.

Receiving a grade of Pass will earn a student credit, but will not factor in their Grade Point Average.

Students and families interested in moving to a Pass/Fail grading system should email our school counselor or principal prior to May 6th. If approved for Pass/Fail, a student's teacher(s) will provide a list of assignments that must be successfully completed by May 20th to earn credit.

Although colleges and scholarship programs are currently revising policies for admission and selection, there may be some later complications for students should they choose to move to a Pass grade versus a letter grade. These may include, but are not limited to, not meeting GPA requirements for Idaho public university admissions, selective college admissions or scholarship competitions. Students should discuss their goals and any concerns with their school counselor.

The goal of this change is to protect Grade Point Averages, to help struggling students stay on track for graduation, and to generally support students through this difficult time.

Dual credit classes will continue to be graded as required by the partner university.
