New Business

Seismic Upgrade Package- (motion needed)-Montgomery moved to approve the seismic upgrade package as presented, Jasper seconded, moved to vote, approved unanimously.

Audit Report- (Pauly Rogers presentation)-Timothy and Brian from Pauly Rogers presented the audit to the board. They stated it was a clean audit opinion with no reservations, no findings, and on page 61 no issues on federal awards. Isom, would like to see about omitting the qualified opinion for the GASB 96, and also the timing of the audits, is there a possibility to get this done before the calendar year that is being audited? They stated they would work on that to the best of their ability. No further discussion.

**Memorandum of Agreement
Between
Knappa School District #4
And
Oregon School Employees Association Knappa Chapter 52**

This Memorandum of Agreement is entered into by and between the Knappa School District (“District”) and the Oregon School Employees Association Knappa Chapter 52 (“Association”). The District and Association are parties to a collective bargaining agreement (“CBA”) with effective dates of July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2025

RECITALS

The parties’ intention with this Memorandum of Agreement (“MOA”) is to clarify extra/co-curricular trip assignments by expanding on Article 16 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement.

TERMS OF MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

1. All extra/co-curricular trips with student participants shall be assigned in accordance with Article 16 of the CBA.

2. The parties agree to the following exception to trip assignments:

The District may, at the District’s discretion, assign up to three (3) extra/co-curricular trips per academic year, each with fewer than seven (7) student participants, to district personnel or approved volunteers outside of the regular drivers in the classified unit.

3. Any provisions of the parties’ CBA not expressly modified by this MOA shall remain in full force and effect.

4. Any disputes regarding an alleged violation or the interpretation or application of this agreement shall be resolved pursuant to the grievance procedure in the CBA between the parties.

5. This MOA shall become effective upon signature of the parties and ratification by OSEA members, if OSEA determines such ratification is required, and it shall remain in effect until superseded by a successor agreement or until June 30, 2025, whichever comes first.

Item Title: Amendment to Superintendent Contract

Presenter: Bill Fritz, Ph.D., Superintendent & Cullen Bangs, Board Chair

Background Information Related to this Issue:

In order to help with the predicted shortfall in the 2024-5 fiscal year caused by limited state funding, the Superintendent has contacted to Board Chair to propose a one-year amendment of the Superintendent's contract.

This amendment shall provide a 5% pay adjustment for the 2024-5 contract year only. As part of this adjustment, the Superintendent's contract days shall be changed from 260 days to 258 days.

The amendment shall be to section 2. The following language shall be inserted:

"SALARY ADJUSTMENT FOR 2024-2025 ONLY. In recognition of the challenging financial conditions for Oregon Schools, the parties agree that the SUPERINTENDENT'S salary for 2024-25 shall be reduced by 5% (to \$131,575) for a one-year period only. Additionally, Section 9 of the 2024-25 agreement shall be amended to require a 258-day work year (rather than the current 260). These amendments shall cease to be in effect on June 30, 2025."

Background (con't)

Financial Impact:

The amendment will reduce District expenses by \$6,925 plus the cost of mandatory benefits.

Recommended Action:

It is the recommendation of the Board Chair and Superintendent that the proposed amendment be authorized by the School Board.

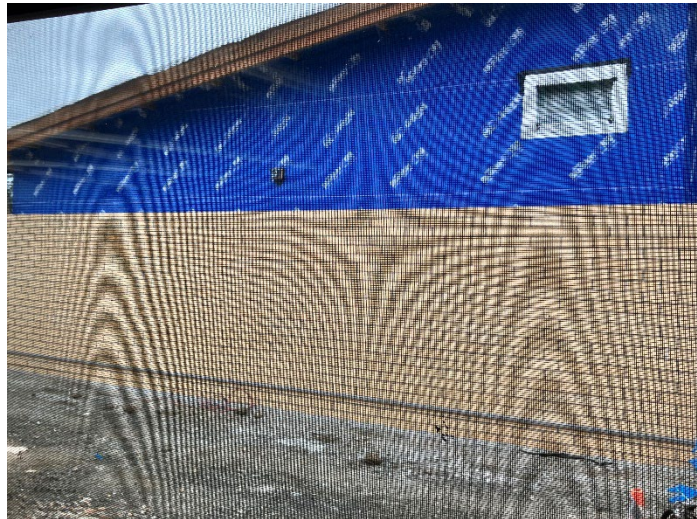
The girls did a fine job as well:

Item Title: Review of Personnel Policies

Presenter: Bill Fritz, Ph.D., Superintendent

Background Information Related to this Issue:

During fall of 2023, the School Board established a Board Goal of conducting a review of the G Policy Series (Personnel) as part of an ongoing policy review cycle.

In response to the Board Goal, the Board and Superintendent also agreed to a Superintendent Goal to engage with staff to provide recommendations to the School Board.

The administrative team has reviewed each of the policies over a period of about five months (looking at a few during each administrative team meeting).

There are no recommended changes in these policies to the Board, although there will be some amendments so some of the Administrative Regulations. Many of these Policies have legal requirements tied to them due to state and federal laws and requirements, which is a primary reason why changes are not required. The policies have either been changed as legal requirements have changed or they currently comply with existing laws.

The review process was helpful to the team, however, causing us to re-familiarize ourselves with the contents of each Policy.

Curriculum Adoption

Item Title: Adoption of Science Curriculum Materials

Presenter: Bill Fritz, Ph.D.

Background Information Related to this Issue:

This year is the adoption year for Science materials. Staff have reviewed the state-adopted options in light of curriculum alignment and suitability for quality instruction. The materials being recommended are Mystery Science for grades K-5, and HMH for middle school and high school.

Both programs are aligned with the Next Generation Science Standards. Mystery Science is a kit-based program that provides activities and experiments to engage students, and it meets the requirements for an independent district adoption.

With this adoption, Ms. Palenske and Ms. Jones will spend time this summer assembling the kits for use in the fall to provide ease of use by teachers.

The materials were made available for review and feedback during conferences, consistent with Board Policy IIA and its associated AR.

Thank you to Ms. Palenske, Ms. Geografo, and Ms. Jones for leading this adoption process.

Background (con't)**Financial Impact:**

The cost of the materials will be included as part of the annual curriculum adoption budget set aside by the Board in the budget process. The cost of the K-6 materials is a one-time cost of \$9,765 plus \$3,680 for manipulatives. The cost for the 6-12 materials will be \$51,415.04, which is under the Superintendent's spending authority, and will fit within the curriculum adoption budget established by the School Board. This provides for a seven-year license for both curricula.

Recommended Action:

It is the recommendation of the Superintendent that the Board adopt Mystery Science via an independent adoption and HMH using a "regular" adoption as the K-12 science curricula.

Another highlight of the month was when the 1st/2nd grade blend class went to meet their adopted cow! Minutes before we arrived, a mother cow had her baby. The students were able to see the first steps and first meal of a new calf. It was precious and the farm allowed the class to name the cow, "Sprinkles"!! These real life experiences are priceless and so important as we connect their in class learning with outside of school.
