

New Dismissal System for the Holiday Programs

We are introducing a new ticketed sign-out system this year for both holiday programs.

1. At Parent/Guardian Arrival:

Get your ticket by showing ID that matches the student's approved pick up list. (Only do this at the matinee if you plan to take your student home with you after the performance.

- staff members will be at the front bus entrance and the rear recess entrance doors before each performance.
- please have your ID ready to keep the line moving
- at the P.M. program, students do not have to wait in the ticket line with you, they may enter the building to start getting ready.
- keep your ticket**

2. At the end of the performance:

Go to Mrs. Mars' classroom at the North end of the hallway. Present your ticket and staff will bring your student to you.

Students will only be released to the person holding the ticket. We know this may be a slightly slow entry, but it will make end-of-performance pickup faster and, most importantly, **ensure all students' safety!** Thank you for your patience.

Students are practicing writing the sounds they hear on their whiteboards rather than matching them to sound cards. In math, kindergarteners are continuing to work with number bonds to support their addition skills.

Our TK students have begun their plant unit, where they are learning that plants are living things, just like animals and humans. In math, they are exploring the numbers 6–10 and learning how to create tally marks.
