Allow your kids easy access to books by placing them strategically throughout your home. *Set aside time each day to read. You might start out with 20 minutes each day and by the end of the summer work up to 1 hour. *Go to the library each week, they frequently have new books to read and enjoy. -Let your child choose their own books. Guide them by suggesting book series that you feel would be age and subject-appropriate for your child. *Plan an activity that centers around their favorite book: If your child likes to read about butterflies, use that opportunity to create a butterfly craft store.
