School Board Meeting
October 13, 2025
Central Office

The Dyersburg City School Board met in regular session at 5:30 p.m. at the Central Office. Jim Coy Houston opened the meeting and welcomed those in attendance. The other School Board members present for the meeting were: Carlos Doss, Courtney Patrick, Gleyn Twilla, Mike Hickman, Dr. Scott Self, and Whitney Allmon

New Business

- TISA Accountability Report—Mrs. Lenita Click presented the TISA Accountability Report to the Board. She noted that the report is available on the district website for public review and comment. The report details the district's four primary goals along with benchmark metrics for measuring progress toward each goal. Upon a motion by Dr. Scott Self and a second by Mrs. Whitney Allmon, the Board approved the report as presented.

- Lisa Slayback–Rough Country Mini-Grant
Overview–Mrs. Lisa Slayback, accompanied by two student representatives from Dyersburg Middle School, presented information about the JAC Club and its current project, Flags for Veterans. Mrs. Slayback and the students shared details about ongoing club activities and fundraising efforts that support the club's initiatives. She also highlighted her Rough Country Grant, through which she and her partner teacher will implement several historical projects and simulations designed to bring history to life for middle school students.
- Safety updates - Josh Rogers–Mr. Josh Rogers, Director of Operations, provided the Board with a safety update. He highlighted the installation of new fencing at Dyersburg Primary School, replacement and upgrades of radios at Dyersburg Intermediate School and the Central Office, and window tinting projects at DMS, DPS, and the College Street Campus. Mr. Rogers also noted the installation of camera battery backups across the district and ongoing camera updates where needed.
- LEA Compliance Report–Mrs. Kim Yeiter presented the 2025 Local Education Compliance Report, noting that Dyersburg City Schools has been certified as “In Compliance” with all applicable federal and state education laws and State Board of Education Rules. Upon a motion by Mr. Carlos Doss and a second by Mr. Glenn Twilla, the Board approved the report as presented.
