<u>COURSE DESCRIPTION:</u> The JROTC curriculum consists of both mandatory and elective Program of Instruction topics according to the Leadership/Education/Training (LET) level in which enrolled. Topics for LET Levels I-IV have been planned and approved by the US Army's Cadet Command (USACC) at FT Knox, KY and accredited by the Southern Association of College and Schools (SACS), and the National Study of School Evaluation (NSSE).

Credit Hours: One credit hour

The course curriculum is designed to provide students a physical education (PE) credit. JROTC enhances students' knowledge and understanding of what is required to become a better citizen while gaining a lifelong appreciation for leadership, physical exercise and service to the community.

The Stanhope Elmore High School JROTC Program is a stimulus for promoting graduation from high school and it provides instruction and rewarding opportunities, which will benefit the student, community and nation. JROTC provides education and training in skills and knowledge like leadership and career goal planning which are useful to students upon graduating from high school. Our goal is to help your child develop a plan for after High School.

<u>CORE COURSE OBJECTIVE:</u> "To motivate young people to be better citizens." With a focus on "Leadership – Attention to Detail – Personal Responsibility – Discipline" (LAPD)

<u>MATERIALS NEEDED:</u> Pen/pencil and a good attitude to learn. A notebook and a Cadet Reference are provided to cadets that they are to bring daily to class.

Laptop issued by the school. (Must bring daily fully charged and ready to work).

COURSE REQUIREMENTS: Students are expected to attend class, follow classroom procedures, participate in classroom learning activities, and complete all assignments on time. Policy for late assignments. Reasonable and rational excuses will be accepted. In case of absence, it is the student's responsibility to make up assignments missed within 3 school days with excused note turned in to main office, according to Stanhope Elmore High School Student Handbook. They are also responsible to get with classmates for any notes they may have missed. Student will be given every opportunity to make up work. Failure to comply with class attendance, course objectives, or class standards will result in low mastery scores.

Teacher parent conferences will be available every Friday. Parents, please coordinate for a specific time by contacting the respective instructor.

As instructors, we will assist your student. Our goal is to prepare students for success in school and life. Parents, we request your support in meeting the demands and obligations of learning and leading. We welcome your assistance in your child's educational pursuits. We follow Stanhope Elmore High School Policies and the Policies of the U.S. Army Cadet Command listed in Cadet Command Regulation 145-2, Army Regulation 670-1.

There is an \$40 LAB FEE for JROTC.

This will purchase a Stanhope Elmore High School JROTC Polo and PT shirt that cadets will wear for special activities and every other Wednesdays. They will need to bring this T-Shirt and School appropriate shorts/sweatpants (No Leggings or Tights) along with proper running shoes to participate in physical fitness training. The last uniform inspection day is 29 April 2026. The cadet will return their JROTC uniform cleaned on or before 8 May 2026 to their instructor only. This helps with the accountability and ensures that all uniforms are serviceable for the next upcoming year.

NOTE: Cadets will be in accordance with AR 670-1 and Cadet Command Regulation 145-2. when in the Dress Uniform.

GRADING SCALE:

90-100 = A 80-89 = B 70-79 = C 60-69 = D Below 60 = F

WEARING OF THE UNIFORM/TEST GRADE: 60% PARTICIPATION, CONDUCT/WEEKLY LEADERSHIP GRADE: 40%

If a cadet is assigned in school suspension they are expected to wear JROTC uniform on Wednesday's and JROTC PT-Shirt on Thursday's. Students assigned to ECAP will be allowed to make up missed work/assignments/grades in an appropriate time as directed by their instructor.

JROTC is designed to be able to help student's GPA, however, they must do what is expected of a Stanhope Elmore High School JROTC Cadet. This is a Leadership Development class and cadets must progress in leadership development to be allowed to attend JROTC out of school functions/activities and be allowed to sign up for JROTC II/III/IV in subsequent years.

If your cadet misses an assignment or absence from school the day of assignment, it's their responsibility to make up any missed assignment within 3 school days. A zero "0" will be placed in the grade book until assignment is completed. At that time an appropriate grade will be entered in the grade book.

Veterans Day Parade: If your cadet misses the Veterans Day Parade without an excuse from the Instructors, their will have to make that grade up by:

- 1. Wearing the Dress Uniform (Graded)
- 2. Writing a 2-page Essay MLA style: Answering the following two questions, (A) What is the Origin of Veterans Day, (B) What do Veterans Day Means to you. (Graded).

<u>ACCOMODATIONS:</u> Any student needing physical accommodations must inform the instructors (with medical/parental documentation if appropriate), and arrangements will be made.

LET TOPICS: (LET I is first year JROTC, LET II is second year JROTC, LET III is third year JROTC and LET IV is fourth year JROTC).

LET-1, The mission of Leadership Education and Training (LET) is to enthusiastically motivate first year JROTC cadets to be better citizens. To accomplish this purpose, the text discusses citizenship, leadership, and a number of other courses designed to help the cadets succeed in high school and after graduation. Cadets wear the JROTC Army uniform once a week, at a minimum. Extracurricular activities include: Participation in community service activities/projects i.e., parades, formal ceremonies, Military Ball, ball games, community clean-up projects, etc.

Returning to JROTC LET II, LET III and LET IV is not guaranteed. It must be earned by participating in the JROTC LET level the cadet is enrolled in. They need to show growth in both leadership and daily participation. JROTC is not a mandatory elective. The Core Mission of JROTC is "Motivate Young People to Become Better Citizens". Cadets need to participate in Community Service Events and JROTC special events such as Military Ball and Parades. JROTC Instructors will mentor cadets and hold them responsible for their actions and deeds.

The LET II/III/IV years will focus on a curriculum that includes: general leadership knowledge, values, organization, decision making processes, group leadership dynamics, following vs. leading, historical military event research and analysis, effective writing, and physical training.

In order to be credentialed through **Career Technical Education** a student only needs three years of JROTC. The three years of JROTC gets you a certificate that makes you College and Career ready as required by the State of Alabama, and if you have a desire to enter into military service you can go in at the pay grade of E-3 opposed to an E-1.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

The Stanhope Elmore High School JROTC will have seven extra-curricular teams for Academic Year 2025-2026: The teams are Drill Team, Color Guard. Physical Fitness Team, Raider Team, Robotics Team, Cyber Patriot Team, Academic and Leadership Teams. All cadets have the opportunity to participate in one of these major competitive activities. During the school year, most of these teams will have the opportunity to compete against other JROTC programs in the State of Alabama as well as World-Wide JROTC programs.

As members of these teams, cadets who participate in competitive events must meet Academic /Grading Standards. Any team member leaving campus to participate in a competition must have a "C" or above in all their classes. The Stanhope Elmore High School JROTC Instructors take academics very seriously and vigorously enforces the state standards. Additionally, all our teams will serve as ambassadors to the public.

NOTE: Cadets participating on the **Raider Team** must have a sports physical and lability form sign by parents to participate. Raider team will consist of **ONLY** 14 total cadets.
