# TK and Kindergarten Mrs. Tinnin

Kindergarten students have been busy learning the letters c, o, and g. They are beginning to sound out simple CVC (consonant–vowel–consonant) words using the letter sounds they've learned so far. Each student has their own set of letter cards, and as we introduce a new letter, they receive a new card to add to their collection. Along with letter recognition, students are also learning the ASL sign and a fun chant for each letter to help reinforce the sounds.

Every day, Kindergarten participates in Listen and Learn activities. Currently, they are exploring the five senses and discovering how each one helps us live in the world around us.

In math, Kindergarten is focusing on numbers 6 through 9. This unit emphasizes understanding number relationships by finding number pairs that make up each number.

TK students are learning about Families and Communities. In math, they continue to explore numbers 1 through 5 through a variety of hands-on, engaging activities designed to build a strong number sense foundation.



## Third and Fourth Grade Classroom

This week students wrote their first multiple paragraph informational writing piece on how and why animals and insects migrate. I was highly impressed with how they applied what they learned during our opinion writing piece to now writing informational pieces. Essays will be going home next week for parents to see.

Students have been working hard on their reading both in and out of school and it shows. We only have three more students before all students have reached Leap 1. Check with your student to see how many points they have earned. Ideally students should be around 15 points now if they want to be on track to make it to the Leap 10 Extravaganza at the end of the year!



# First and Second Grade Explorers Mrs. Mittge

This week we wrote an expository paragraph on how to dress for fall.

First grade students began their first ELA reader this week. They have been doing an exceptional job of text diving and writing complete sentences to demonstrate understanding! Second graders will be ready to begin their second unit next week!

First graders should be reading more than 10 words per minute with the goal of reading 50 words per minute this winter. Second graders should be reading 30-80 words per minute with the goal of reading more than 100 words per minute this winter. Most students are well above these goals!

Students have earned over 20 class stars! To celebrate we had a snack and stuffy play date. Students had a snack with their stuffy and then met other class stuffies. Students and stuffies had a great time playing together.
