HEALTH OFFICE

We are grateful to have our nurse Ms. Berstler with us all day. She will be on campus from 7:30am-3pm daily to help serve our students and monitor our needs during this time. She will be monitoring any student's needs, and assess students or staff as needed for any injury or potential signs of illness. We ask that ALL parents do their due diligence in screening your children for any signs of illness before reporting to school. Students who show any COVID related signs of illness will be monitored by our nurse.

KEEPING OUR CAMPUS HEALTHY!

We are so excited to be able to have students on campus full time this year and allow for parents to join us for our events. With that said, we need assistance from families in ensuring that students who are showing symptoms of illness are kept home. COVID related illness, among other things such as the flu and strep throat, are highly transmittable. So, if your student says they are not feeling well or showing signs of stuffiness, cough, sore throat, fever, fatigue, etc. it

SAFETY AND SECURITY

At Jamaica, we take safety of our students, staff, and guests seriously; therefore we are a closed campus.

- Please refrain from coming into the school to wait for your child at pick up time by the classroom door. Students will meet you outside after the 2:30pm bell. Thank you for everyone's help with this.
- It is critical for safety that all guests, including parents and guardians, check in at the front office and sign in for a visitor's badge. We ask that you do not go into the classrooms without an appointment.
- The gates are staying locked in the mornings until 7:45am. This is for the safety and security of our students in the mornings. Students should wait near the building and away from the drive through lane.
- In the parking lot, please use the cross walk and do not walk in front of traffic.
