COURSE DESCRIPTION

Forensic and Criminal Investigation is a rapidly developing area of the Law, Public Safety, Corrections, and Security cluster. Forensic and criminal investigators provide assistance to firefighters and law enforcement officers as well as the criminal justice system. This one-credit course focuses on career opportunities, safety, history of forensic science, criminal investigation, forensic serology and DNA testing, forensic studies in anthropology, toxicology, fingerprinting, firearms, physics, and document examination.
