The administration strives to make each student's high school years productive and to help each student become an able citizen in his or her adult years.



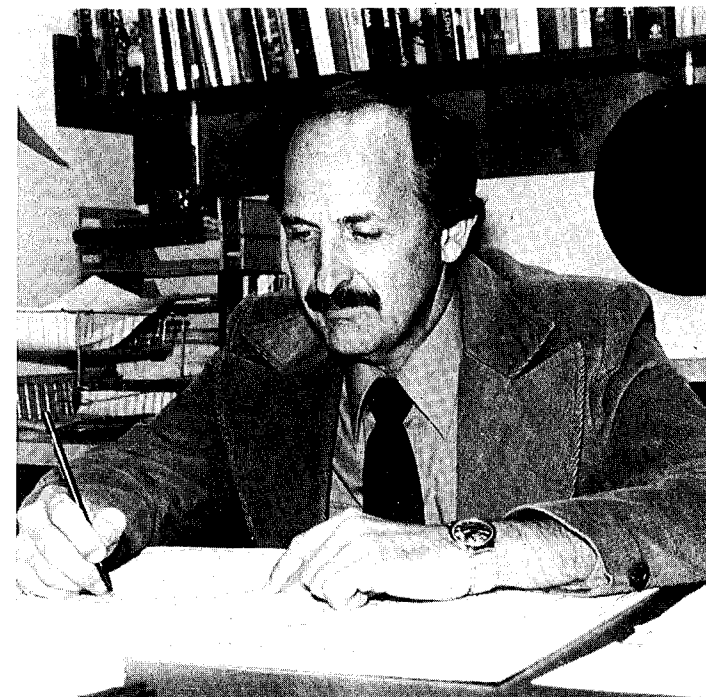

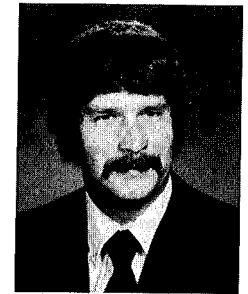

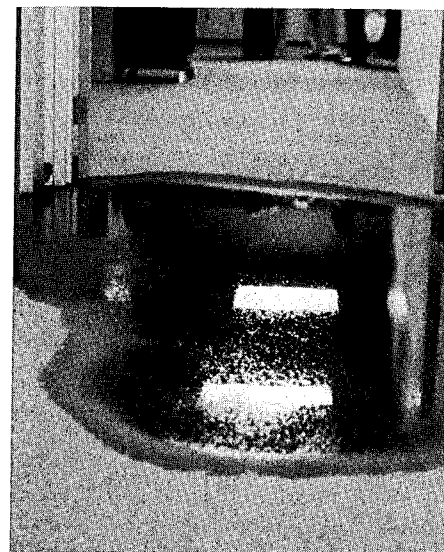

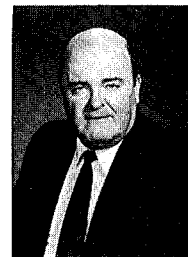

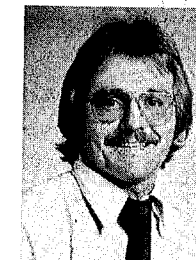
Exceptional Education Prepares for Future Employment

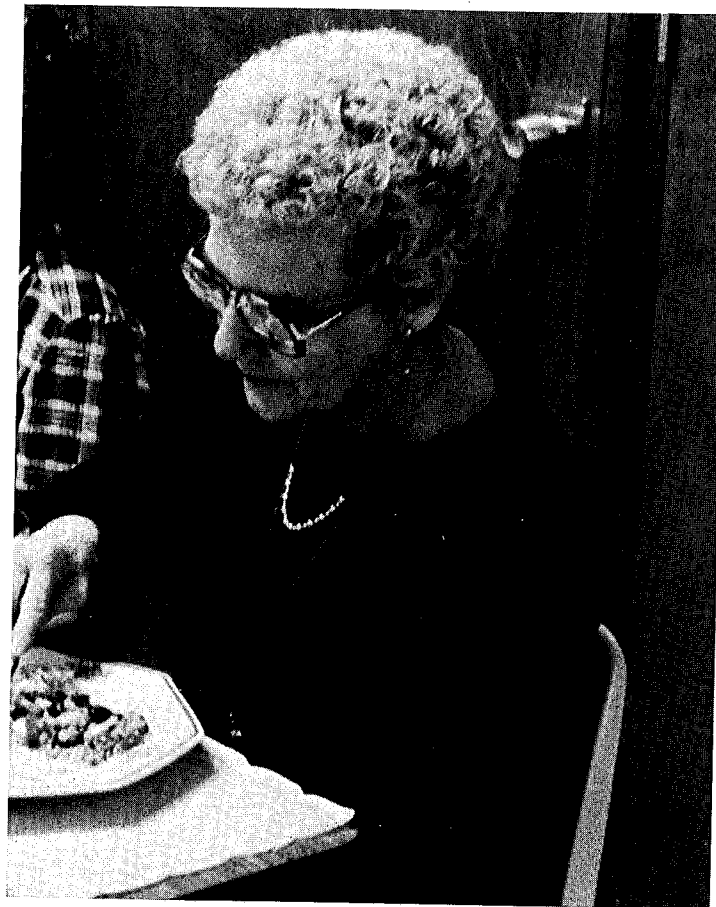
Here Comes the Bride

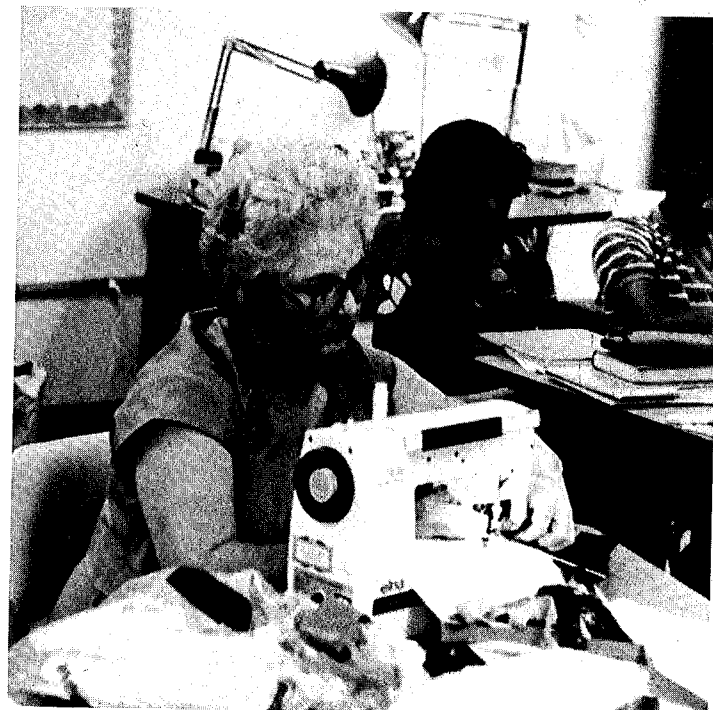

Students Save Money By Repairing Their Own Autos

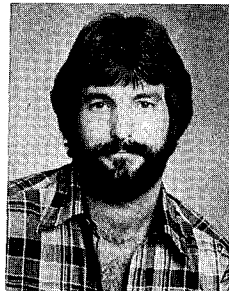

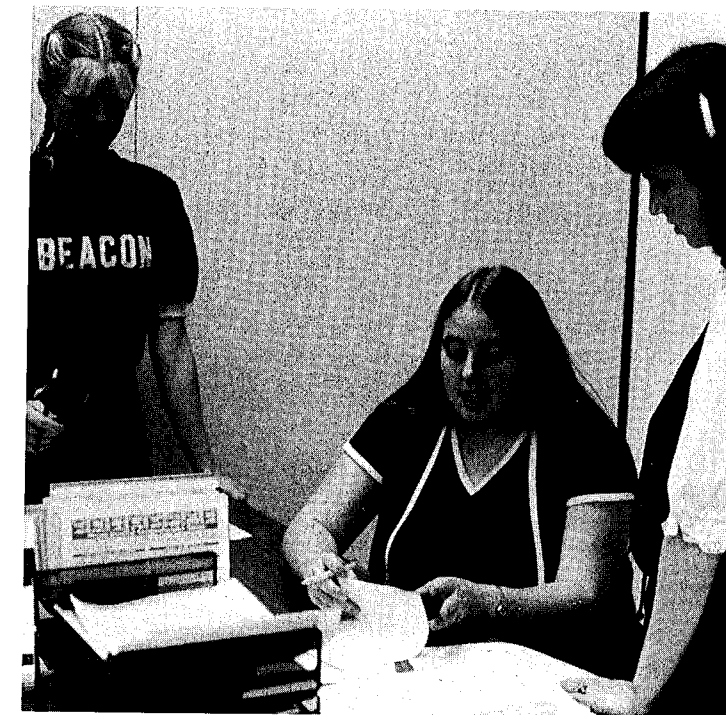

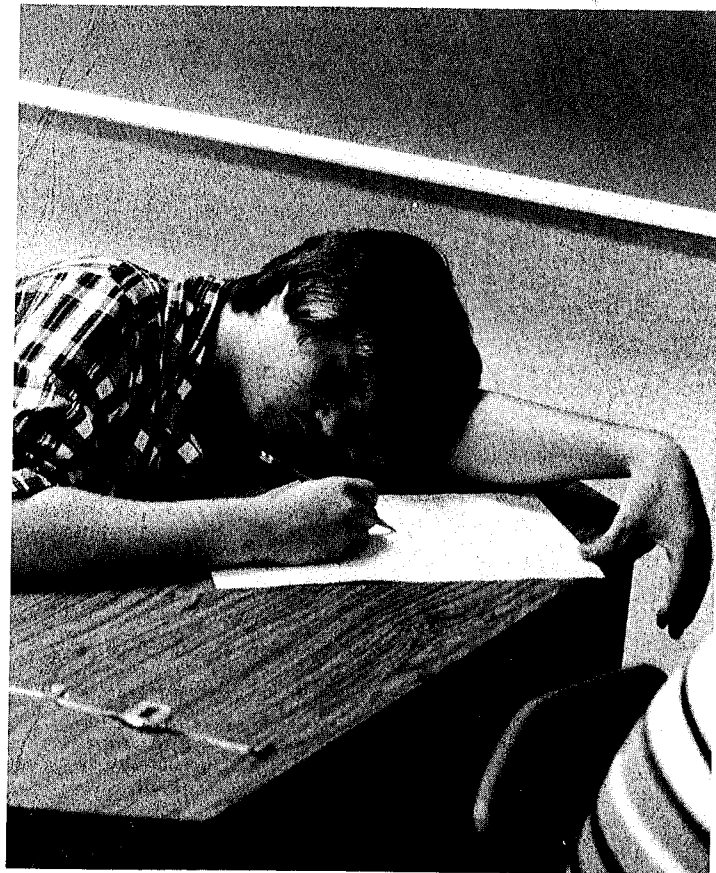

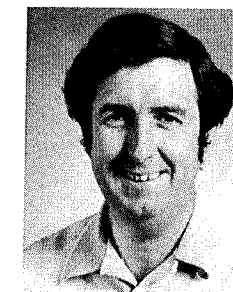

JROTC Teaches Students Leadership

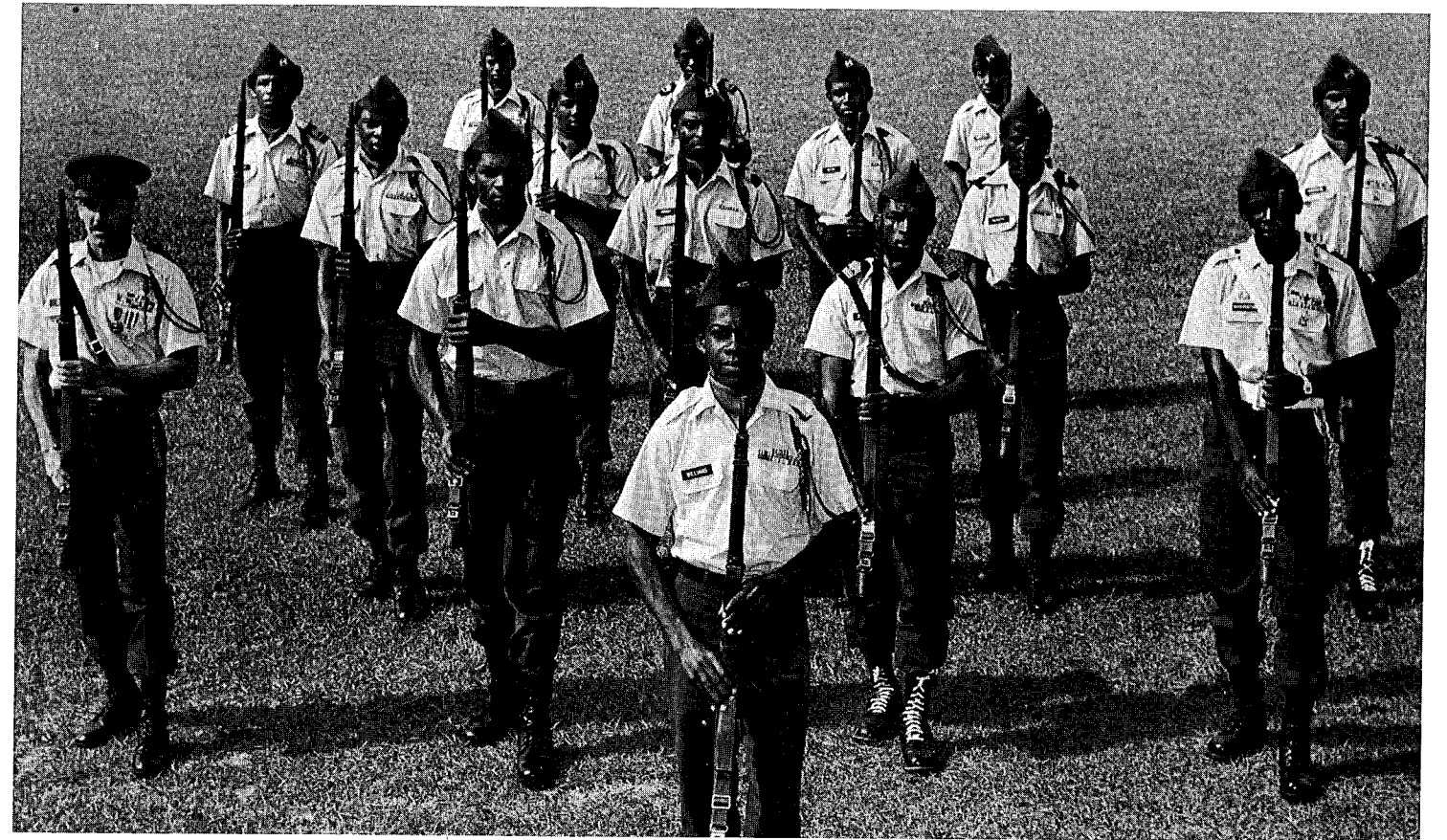
The University of Tampa, Lake City, Mulberry, and the University of Florida were some of the places that the ROTC unit traveled to. At the University of Tampa, the drill and rifle team competed and gave a fine performance, although they did not place. Lake City was the site of the All Florida Drill and Rifle competition; Mulberry High School was the All County County Drill and Rifle meet site.

Once a year the Inspector General's office, Department of the Army, in Washington inspects each ROTC unit to assure compliance with the Army regulations. On March 18, the JROTC annual inspection was held, an activity in which the student body was able to participate. Officers from Ft. Bragg, the headquarters of the Lake Wales JROTC, came to watch and judge the JROTC unit as they formed for inspection on the field in uniform.

The ROTC department not only prepares young men and young women for possible service in the armed forces, but also helps the young person gain confidence in himself and in his country. Students learn skills in leadership. The organization is set up like the Army program.
