SJRCS will be offering a HSPT Test Prep course via Google Meet/Classroom to review math and language arts concepts and learn some test-taking strategies starting mid October lasting 6 weeks. Registration link will be provided shortly and cost of the course is \$60 + \$15 for the book. SJRCS has some books in stock and available for purchase \$15.

Scantron Testing - This year standardized testing will use <u>Scantron Testing</u> will be administered three times a year; concentrating on the content areas of reading, literature, and math, and science and social studies midyear. Our first round of testing will take place the week of September 13th during LA and Math class.

Face Mask Reminder - This is a reminder that Cloth face coverings should be:

- solid-colored or printed made with at least 2 layers of breathable material
- fit snugly and comfortably against the side of the face (cover nose, mouth, and secure under the chin)
- masks with inappropriate or political messages or innuendos are not permitted
- neck gaiters, open-chin triangle bandanas, and containing valves, mesh material, or holes of any kind are not acceptable.
