
INDOMINATION RULES THE WORLD

The Carroll County School System is deeply rooted in a culture of excellence. Our mindset is one where every individual plays a vital role in fostering a high-achieving environment that **prepares students for lifelong success**.

This unified approach ensures that students are not only prepared academically but also equipped to be engaged, responsible citizens, reflecting the system's mission to empower students for their futures, whether they choose to be **enrolled, enlisted, or employed**.

The system's own measure of students who go beyond traditional graduation requirements to prepare for college, employment, or the military – called **G+ – increased 14 points to 70 percent** indicating that more students are being intentional about choosing a path for their future after high school.


The collective action of Carroll County's

The Carroll County School System places an unwavering emphasis on school safety, recognizing it as the absolute top priority. This commitment is evident through extensive investments in security measures and proactive initiatives designed to protect students and staff. We utilize cutting-edge tools like SchoolDog, a data collection app that helps administrators identify and address potential vulnerabilities in real-time, ranging from human error to mechanical malfunctions. The district also fosters strong collaborations with local law enforcement and first responders, conducting annual safety summits and deploying numerous School Resource Officers across campuses to ensure a coordinated and immediate response to any threat. Beyond physical security, Carroll County prioritizes student well-being through comprehensive social emotional wellness services, ensuring a supportive environment where students can thrive safely. This multi-faceted approach underscores the district's dedication to creating secure and nurturing learning environments for the entire school community.

Students have access to handson, real world experiences in a variety of subject areas that prepare them to be college and career ready upon graduation. Additionally, the district continues to be the only school system in Georgia that has two College and Career Academy campuses.

12 FOR LIFE,

a nationally recognized work-based learning program that combines classroom instruction with on-the-job training through a partnership with the Southwire Company, recently opened its new 900 square foot Mechatronics Lab. This new lab has expanded course offerings to include a collaborative robot trainer, Industrial Plastics trainer, and Intermediate Pneumatics trainer in addition to other state-of-the-art training equipment.


