

Happy November DEC Families and Friends! Last month, Chinatown classroom helped transition two children into Laguna Preschool Head Start AND receive two children who were on our waitlist. We are happy to be a part of their school journey and hope they continue to learn and grow happily with their new teachers and classmates.

October was an interesting month, our children learned how to protect their clothing when painting or working with dirt by wearing a smock—which they wore when visiting the PRC for a greenhouse activity. They had fun painting their seed pots and planting seeds with our Greenhouse Project team. We were able to participate and see how the other planted seeds are growing. Our visits will happen on Thursdays at 9:00-9:30 a.m., unless it is rescheduled. Thank you to the Pueblo of Laguna Health Education Program for your introduction to healthy opportunities and experiences to our young children!

Our kids worked on using their self-help skills to pulling down and pulling up their clothing, seeing how to connect their zippers, and putting on their jackets. We are still working on picking up their toys and putting them away rather than leaving them on the floor; friendship skills by sharing and taking turns; and, using your words to say how you feel. Families, if you haven't read the poem titled "The Toddler's Creed" please do—it is a hilarious look into a young child's perspective.

This month we hope to promote your children's learning by introducing brushes. We use brushes for cleaning, self-help, cooking, and creating art. We will show the different types and uses of brushes (with clean and never been used brushes) for our kids to explore. They will grow independence by practicing to use brushes independently, increase fine motor skills by holding and manipulating a variety of brushes; build their vocabulary with the different types of brushes; increase their imagination by using real brushes in dramatic play and increasing their cognitive skills with exploring brushes with similarity and differences; and, show understanding of people who use brushes in their jobs and showing understanding of positional words. Our Culture Lifeways will bring a new look at forest animals and what hunting is: how animals bless us with

food and materials (moccasins, drums). They will be introduced to Keresan words that are: deer, elk, turkey, mountain lion, antelope, bear, rabbit, blue birds, ducks, and mountain.

What We Learned

Creative Curriculum: Our theme for the month of October was clothes. Our children learned the types of clothes they wore as the weather changed. Our children are still in the process of learning how to dress themselves, especially putting on their jackets. This is helping them to develop their fine motor and problem-solving skills by working with buttons, snap buttons, zippers, etc. We have recognized and identified colors and patterns on our shirts. Cultural Lifeways: Our children have been learning the process of planting through the Greenhouse project presented by the Laguna Health Education Department. Our children have tasted zucchini, squash, and beans. The ladies were gracious to cook and share with our children. S.T.E.A.M.: Colors of Nature! What colors of Nature can we see out and around the school? Children went out in to the plaza area to name the colors of the flowers that are blooming and matched colors. **Nutrition Activity:** Our children made Pretzel and cheese broomsticks. They

mainly enjoyed eating the pretzels

and the cheese.

Creative Curriculum: Brushes

Our theme for the month of November will be Brushes. Children will explore, identify, and recognize variety of brushes. The children will hold and manipulate variety of brushes and learn how to use brushes for different activities, e.g., paint brush, toothbrush, hair brush, broom, homemade brushes. Children will learn to be independent as they select brushes, they want to use and how to use them.

Cultural Lifeways: What is hunting? Children will learn that animals are a blessing that provides food, happiness, and blessings to the home.

Mountains are sacred places where animals live.

S.T.E.A.M.: Exploring Trees. Our children will learn what animals live in trees, see and feel tree trunks.

Health / Nutrition Activities: Frozen Yogurt covered Blueberries


Greeting Family and Friends,

What We Learned

Achievements:

The children know the colors in English and in our Keres language with little cues. The children are at 50% in mastering the months of the year. The class is now 100% potty-trained. Congratulations to the children on all their achievements. We are so proud of you.

Creative Curriculum:

The theme for November is Percussion Instruments. The children playing percussion instruments, from tambourines to rhythm sticks, provide opportunities for them to discover rhythm patterns, problem-solve how to create different kinds of sounds, and keep the beat as they collaborate to make music together.

Cultural Lifeways:

Children will learn that animals are a blessing that provides food, happiness, and brings blessings to the home, and that the mountains are a sacred place where all animals live.

Vocabulary:

- ·Eat Healthy- try to include more fruits, vegetables, whole grains, lean meats, and low-fat dairy products in your diet.


National Health Observances for November

INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PROGRAM GUIDANCE

Research and experience have shown that to improve results for children with special needs, programs must:

- · Have high expectations for all children regardless of abilities
- · Meet each child's needs to enable the children to access, participate and progress in the regular curriculum to the maximum extent possible -complete inclusion.
- · Ensure that special education is a **service**, rather than a place
- · Provide appropriate special education services and supports in the general education classroom (IEP) & IFSPs (or home - IFSPs)
- The Individual Family Service Plan (IFSP–developed for children birth to age 3) and the Individual Education Plan (IEP-developed for children age 3 and older) are the tools that are used to document how each child's needs related to his/her a special concerns will be met within the setting of an educational environment or for infants/toddler services will also be provided in the child's home environment.

<u>FOSTERING EMOTIONAL & MENTAL HEALTH</u>

Early Childhood is a delicate period where brain development is at its peak, making it a time of opportunity and understanding.

With this in mind, parents and other adult caregivers, need to understand how every little action they carry out can impact their children's understanding of the world.

*If parents/care-givers respond in a healthy, supportive way when children are struggling, their children in turn will show themselves this same understanding, patience and love when they struggle with "upsets" and anxiety as they get older.

*Positive interactions in time of trouble, whether it's reading to a child to help them calm down, stroking their hair when they're crying, or even just sitting with them while they work through their own problems, "Helps the brain wire itself for RESILIENCE!"

Catch children being "GOOD"-meaning to notice & praise children for "things they are doing well that are easy to miss because we expect them to happen.

Hello everyone!

Division of Early Childhood is currently recruiting for new students. Our Early Headstart Program, serving ages 6 months to 3 years old, classrooms are currently full but we are still accepting applications. Submitted applicants will be put on a waitlist. In our transition classroom (EHS to PHS) we will have children transition out to Preschool Headstart (when child turns 3 years old) so there may be a slot open if your child is on the waitlist.

Pre-School Headstart, serving 3 years to 5 years old, classrooms are not full, so all applications are considered.

As stated in the October newsletter, I am giving shout-outs to the classrooms who have 86% attendance or higher. The classrooms are:

Paguate classroom - 86%
