TK and Kindergarten

Kindergarten students are currently learning the vowel pattern “ee” and exploring the concept of the “bossy e.” They are also working on animal research packets and will begin their own individual animal research projects next week, which they will later present to the class.

TK students have recently completed their study of desert habitats. They will take a short break from habitat studies to enjoy a read-aloud with activities of *Why Flies Buzz*.

In math, Kindergarten students are developing skills in comparing height, weight, and length. TK students are also exploring these concepts through partner activities and games to reinforce their understanding.

Throughout the year, your child has learned a variety of nursery rhymes accompanied by motions. We encourage you to ask your child to share and demonstrate what they have learned.

Because testing can be long and tiresome we will keep the class light in the afternoon and still do students normal specialists.
