## Graduation & College/Career Readiness

We are pleased to report that seven students have earned their high school diplomas, each demonstrating resilience, dedication, and readiness to transition into higher education, the military, or the workforce. Our team continues to focus on increasing graduation rates through individualized support and interventions. 84% of our students remain on track for on-time graduation, reflecting significant progress in academic planning, attendance, and credit accumulation.

## Career and Technical Education (CTE) Success

This year marked an outstanding level of achievement in our CTE programs. Students earned twenty-nine welding certifications, providing them with industry-recognized skills and certifications that open doors to employment and apprenticeships immediately following their transition back into their communities. Additionally, four students successfully completed our barista certification program and are now certified and employable in local businesses once they transition out of Monroe School, exemplifying our school's emphasis on real-world learning and employability.

## Academic Performance

Academic achievement remains a cornerstone of our work. Over 60% of our students tested at or above grade level across core academic areas. This data represents ongoing efforts in curriculum alignment, formative assessment practices, and targeted academic interventions. Teachers have worked collaboratively through professional learning communities to analyze student data and adjust instruction to meet student needs.
