## **Featured articles**

#### Kindergarten

Kindergarten has been working on procedures and how to navigate around the school. We are also working on fine and gross motor skills along with independence in the classroom.

Kindergarten would love to host 'Breakfast with Santa" on Friday, December 10, 2021. The breakfast will be \$5 to take a picture with Santa. Look for more information to come home later. The kindergarten students will also put on a Christmas show for the parents.

We are looking forward to having our first field trip of the school year in October. More information will be sent home soon. We are encouraging all parents to keep working with their child on sight words, letter and letter sound recognition, and reading for at least 30 minutes each day.

#### **First Grade**

We are reviewing and refreshing Kindergarten skills. We are introducing skills that help the students become more responsible for their own learning. In Math we are working on addition, using manipulatives which makes the concept of number sense real. In ELA/Writing, we are working on short vowels in words, sight words, and retelling a story using simple sentences and pictures. The students are really excited about being exposed to music this year and they really love Ms. Rudd.



#### Second Grade

Second grade is moving along with all of our beginning of the year testing. The students are enjoying reading books on epic and playing prodigy in their extra time.

### Third Grade

Third grade is hoping to visit Lowry Park Zoo this Fall, go to the Lakeland Tigers Game in the Spring, and possibly a couple other field trips this year. We will need approved volunteers to help chaperone on the upcoming field trips and look forward to new experiences with our students. In math will be working with strategies to multiply and divide. In reading we are working on creating readers who can ask important questions while they read and are able to identify the main idea with supporting details. In science we are working on classifying matter and the states of water.

#### Fourth Grade

For the month of September, both 4th and 5th grade will be learning how to write expository essays. They will learn how to plan, write, and revise 5 paragraph essays. In reading, 4th grade will be learning about Expository text and Realistic Fiction, while 5th grade is learning about narrative nonfiction and Realistic Fiction.



#### Fifth Grade

For the month of August, both 4th and 5th grade have been learning about the Scientific Method and will begin learning about Earth, the Milky Way, the Solar System and the Phases of the Moon. In Math, the 4th grade students are learning about place value, adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing whole numbers. While the 5th grade students will be learning about decimals while adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing.

5th grade has a Kona Ice fundraiser scheduled for September 9th at Open House!!

# Home and School Connection

New Law Requires Students to Observe a Moment of Silence Daily This year, all Florida public schools will be required to begin each day with a moment of silence. Under the new law, known as a "Moment of Silence in Public Schools," first-period teachers at all grade levels will be required to set aside one to two minutes at the start of the school day for a moment of silence and student reflection. Each student will determine how to best use this time. Parents are encouraged to have conversations at home and provide guidance.

Teachers cannot suggest how students spend this time, and no student can interfere with another student's moment of silence.
