























LWHS Dresses Up








Highlanders Fought Hard


Freshmen Learn To Create Spirit

Winning's The Thing For The Lady Highlanders As They Claim Regional




Jayvee Basketball Team Racks Up Seventeen Straight Victories





















Girls Defeat Lakeland
