TRANSPORTATION DISPATCHER/INSTRUCTOR

BASIC FUNCTION:

Under supervision, train prospective and district employed school bus drivers, assist in maintaining an active safety training program, generate statistical reports and maintain records.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES:

- Train prospective school bus drivers as well as those currently employed by the school district. *E*
- Instruct drivers in all phases of bus operation, use of equipment, safety practices, first aid, laws, regulations, and other training necessary for certification requirements to become a bus driver as well as for bus driver renewal certificates. *E*
- Assist Transportation Manager in establishment of bus routes and stops, and make reports regarding any safety hazards. *E*
- Assist in maintaining records for all drivers' certification. E
- Keep abreast of federal and state laws and regulations and district policies and procedures. E
- Meet with parents and school officials on pupil discipline, including the discussion of bus conduct reports. *E*
- Respond to late evening and weekend telephone calls from drivers and staff. E
- Serve as liaison with staff, California Highway Patrol, and other organizations as required. *E*
- Dispatch drivers, buses and district vehicles. E
- Operate a school bus over designated routes in transporting students. E
- Operate office machines including computer, calculator, copier, and audio-visual equipment. E
- Gather and compile information for reports. E
- Type letters, agendas, reports, and other documents requiring independent judgement as to format and content. *E*
- Set up and maintain filing systems. E
- Order supplies and equipment. E
- Provide information for and assistance to staff, public and students. E
- Supervise other employees and/or students. E
- Responsible for department in absence of supervisor. E
- Other related duties.
