

Medicaid Eligibility in Texas

Regular Medicaid or CHIP:

- Must be 19 years or younger
- Must be a U.S Citizen or Permanent Resident
- Low income

Special Circumstances for Medicaid over 19 year of Age

- Medicaid for Pregnant Women or CHIP Perinatal
 - Pregnant
 - > Low income
 - > Texas resident
- Medicaid for Foster Youth Between 19-25
 - Was in the foster system from 18 years of age or older
 - ➤ Had Medicaid while in foster care system
 - > U.S Citizen or Permanent Resident
- Medicaid for Children and Adults with Disabilities
 - > U.S Citizen or Permanent Resident
 - Low income
 - > Have a disability
 - Already on Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
 - > Already receive Home and Community-based Services (HCS) or Texas Home Living (TxHmL)
 - ➤ Have been placed in a nursing or care home for individual with intellectual disabilities
 - > Age 65 or older or person who has a disability that is expected to last a year or longer
- Medicaid for Adult Caring for a Child
 - > Related to the child being taken care of
 - > The child is enrolled in Medicaid
 - > Extremely low income
 - U.S Citizen or Permanent Resident

If you fall under any of these criteria, you or your children may be eligible for Medicaid.
