Course Overview:

Students will develop the tools and understanding required to mathematically prove simple geometric conjectures, explore right triangle trigonometry, circles, and common 3-dimensional volumes, and establish the connections between a figure's geometric and algebraic representations. Lastly students will extend their comprehension of probability to include conditional probabilities and variable independence.

Attendance:

All courses require attention to attendance and missing work. Geometry is no exception. Students should monitor Google Classroom posts and assignments diligently even if off-campus. Every effort will be made to engage students who miss instruction; however, students are also expected to make efforts to stay engaged. As a reminder, students should not disable notifications from Google Classroom. These notifications are sent when materials are posted and an assignment is due or late.

Grading:

Each assignment will fall in one of the three following categories with assigned weight:

Homework: 30% Ouizzes: 50% **Tests: 20%**

Students will complete a cumulative assessment each Semester: a MidTerm at the end of Semester 1 and a Final Exam at the end of Semester 2. Both the Mid-Term and Final Exam will count as a Test grade for the Nine Weeks. The Final Exam will cover information from Semester 2 only.

Assignments will be categorized based on the amount of time and work needed for completion. For example, a Warm-Up activity could be counted as a Homework task, a vocabulary crossword as a Quiz task, a presentation or graphing assignment completed over several class sessions may be counted as a Test, etc.

Students will be advised of the category of each assignment to remain motivated for completion and should check the Infinite Campus Student Portal, CCS email account, and Google Classroom REGULARLY to monitor progress and classroom communication.

Chromebooks:

Students have been assigned a Chromebook for the school year. Students are responsible to charge the Chromebook each evening and bring the Chromebook to class each day. Because our courses will rely heavily upon Google Classrooms this school year, <u>students failing to bring their assigned</u>, <u>charged</u> Chromebook to class may receive a zero as a Homework score for that day.
