This week we are finishing up our animal research reports and presentations. Everyone worked hard and had fun learning about their animal. Next week, we will start our last chapter in math learning about sorting. It is a very short chapter so when we finish, we will review a couple of skills students struggled with during previous chapters.

We continue to make observations of our pumpkin seeds we are growing in the classroom. Everyone has their own observation journal. It is fun to see the difference in growth over such a short time. Part of the observations is counting the leaves and measuring how tall their plant is using paperclips chained together.
