Gateway Celebrates 37 Years













Native American And Alaska Native Heritage Month



National Native American and Alaska Native Heritage Month is celebrated every November to honor the diverse cultures and educate the public about the heritage, history, art, and traditions of the indigenous peoples who lived in the Americas before European colonization. These groups have endured persecution, war, and even genocide while striving to keep their traditions alive in the face of difficult circumstances.

They have lived in the Americas for thousands of years and have made many contributions to American society.

Some things we wouldn't have without Native Americans:

- 1. Barbecues, hammocks, kayaks, and moccasins are all Native American words adopted into our modern culture.
- 2. Canoeing, lacrosse, and tug-of-war were sports created by Native Americans
- 3. The log cabin was an adaptation of the Indian log or longhouse
- 4. Corn, 14 different beans, maple syrup, wild rice, pumpkin, and avocado started with Native American farmers.

Native Americans Who Left a Lasting Impact


Native Americans have undeniably shaped the world with remarkable achievements and unwavering spirit. These courageous leaders, innovative thinkers, influential artists, and passionate activists have made profound and lasting impacts on American history. Their contributions are essential and should be recognized for their significance.



<u>Dr. Susan La Flesche Picotte</u> was a member of the Omaha tribe and the first Indigenous woman in the United States to earn a medical degree. In addition to her medical career, she worked tirelessly to promote sobriety on the reservation and fought against tuberculosis, which, at that time, had no cure.



<u>Sitting Bull</u>, a prominent Hunkpapa Lakota leader, led his people in resisting U.S. government policies for many years. His life ended tragically on the Standing Rock Indian Reservation when Indian agency police attempted to arrest him, fearing his involvement with the Ghost Dance movement. He is remembered for his courage in defending native lands.



Jim Thorpe, an exceptional American athlete, and Sac and Fox Nation member, made history as the first Native American to win a gold medal for the United States in the Olympics. He secured two gold medals at the 1912 Summer Olympics, contributing to his lasting legacy.

Gateway Observes National Hunger and Homeless Awareness Week



Gateway Community Action Partnership joined fellow CAP Agencies and organizations nationwide in recognizing National Hunger and Homeless Awareness Week. We salute our staff in our programs aimed at assisting these populations, including:

- Gateway's Emergency Assistance Food Pantry distributes bulk food supplies free of charge to needy residents
- The Mill Creek Urban Farm, operated by Gateway Community Action Partnership, is a threeacre community farm located on a former housing project site on Mill Street in Bridgeton. Established in 2009, the farm aims to provide a sustainable food source for residents and foster community involvement.

Since 1995, Gateway's Gleaning Program has collected and distributed millions of pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables from fields that have already been commercially harvested. The gleaned food is of near-market quality and would otherwise go to waste. This produce is provided free of charge to local soup kitchens in the Cumberland-Gloucester-Salem region.

- WIC is a supplemental nutrition program for eligible women, infants, and children with an arm that provides eWIC benefits for nutritious foods and baby formula.
- Head Start programs provide comprehensive services to enrolled children and their families, which include health, nutrition, social, and other services determined to be necessary by family needs assessments, in addition to education and cognitive development services.
 - Gateway's Social Services include emergency shelter programs, winter warming sites (Code Blue), weatherization, and home energy assistance (LIHEAP/USF).
- Housing and Development. Since its founding, Gateway Community Action Partnership has undertaken various construction, rehabilitation, and renovation initiatives to revitalize the Cumberland, Salem, and Gloucester County areas. These efforts are dedicated to offering affordable housing options for low- to moderate-income families. If you know anyone needing these services, please direct them to Gateway CAP at 856-461-6330.

Finally, our partnership with the Village of Hope offers "tiny home" housing and comprehensive support services to guide parolees towards self-sufficiency as they transition from incarceration to becoming productive, law-abiding citizens.
