- We instill in students the value of service to others.


Our Students are on a Roll...

The Principal's List Award recipients - those students who achieved at least a 95% average in all classes - enjoyed a pizza lunch with Dr. Higgins for all their hard work!






8th Graders Are Competing in Law Day

We Teach a "Growth Mindset"

Our teachers recently had a professional development session on Growth Mindset. We want to teach our students this important life skill - that no matter what age, their response to challenges or setbacks will be determined by if they have a growth mindset or a fixed mindset.

A student with a growth mindset believes, "I can't do it...YET." When a person with a fixed mindset hits an obstacle, they believe, "this is all I can do." Teachers can teach growth mindset using their environment, language, communication, and modeling a growth mindset.

The recent research on neuroplasticity indicates that the human brain continues to learn and change throughout our lives. Two leading authors on growth mindset and grit are Dr. Carol Dweck and Angela Duckworth. Our goal is to set students up for success.






Raffles, Chocolates, and more!

Most of our families receive scholarships or financial aid to help offset the \$7,500 tuition. Because of the gap in tuition and the per-pupil expense, St. Catherine Catholic School relies heavily on fundraising and donations to help cover school operations, improvements, and programs.
