Hello, New Milford Families, Students, Faculty, and Staff, It has been a rainy and gray winter so far, and we are lucky to have so many exciting and joyful events taking place across all of our schools in January. The late fall and winter seasons also bring our annual school district budget development presentations and meetings. Our school administrators and central office department directors work hard each year to present requests that meet the needs of our students and our schools while maintaining a stance of fiscal

On Thursday, January 25, the Board of Education adopted a budget following all of the school and department presentations. The Board of Education adopted budget presents a 3.87% increase over the 2023-24 district budget. We look forward to explaining to families what is

contained in the Board of Education adopted budget over the upcoming weeks. The Board of Education adopted budget is then presented to the Town Council and Board of Finance for their consideration on February 29. The final step in the budget process is the Town-Wide Referendum in May. As always, please reach out with any questions you might have about the budget or budget process as we move on through the months.

#### **Wave Awards**



### Middle Level Student Leadership Conference

Held at Naugatuck Valley Community College, this conference allowed SMS students the opportunity to collaborate with students from other schools in the area. Additionally, students participated in

presentations and workshops designed to help them build on some foundational leadership skills. These skills include communication, problem solving, critical thinking, and decision making. All of the students that attended the conference are part of the club Student Leaders for a Change. The purpose of this club is allow students the opportunity to have a voice as we work collaborative to make positive changes to the climate and culture at Schaghticoke. Additionally, involvement with this group provides students opportunities to develop and refine their leadership skills. 


### **Fire Marshall Contest**





### Food and Nutrition News




