SCHOOL-PARENT COMPACT



The Leinkauf Elementary School, and the parents of the students participating in activities, services, and programs funded by Title I, Part A of the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 (ESSA), agree that this compact outlines how the parents, the entire school staff, and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and the means by which the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve the State’s high standards. **This school-parent compact is in effect during school year 2023-2024.**

Leinkauf School Responsibilities

1. **Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State’s student academic achievement standards as follows:** *Leinkauf Elementary School offers a high-quality curriculum by highly qualified faculty and staff. We do this with a well-equipped, supportive faculty that provides an effective learning environment with minimal disruptions and distractions. All teachers are trained through staff development that enables them to instruct students at various levels and in a variety of ways to meet academic challenges.*
2. **Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child’s achievement.** *All initial parent-teacher conferences will be held first quarter. During these conferences, teachers will discuss classroom expectations, goals for the school year, and rules and procedures to manage student behavior. Conferences can be completed by teacher or parent request.*
3. **Provide parents with frequent reports on their children’s progress.** *To ensure parents are kept abreast of their child’s academic progress, mid-quarter progress reports and quarterly report cards are sent home in two ways: (1) hand-delivered by students and (2) mailed through the United States Postal Service. Additionally, grades can also be checked in Schoology by parents at any time.*
4. **Provide parents reasonable access to staff.** *Our staff will be available for conferencing during teacher planning times, before and after school to accommodate a parent’s work schedule.*
5. **Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child’s class, and to observe classroom activities.** *We welcome your efforts through classroom volunteers, the Parent Advisory Council, field trips, and the eProve Committee.*
6. **Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members, school staff and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand.** *To keep the lines of communication, open between the home and school, parents should complete the following tasks:*
 - (1) *Join Class Dojo to allow the teacher to contact you daily.*
 - (2) *Require students to read fluency passage/words each night.*
 - (3) *Provide an updated email, home address, and telephone number.*
 - (4) *Check child’s folder and planner daily.*
 - (5) *Subscribe to our YouTube page, follow us on Twitter, and like us on Facebook.*

Parent Responsibilities

We, as parents, will support our children’s learning in the following ways:

- *Ensure that your child attends school daily.*
- *Ensure that your child is on time to school daily.*
- *Refrain from excessive early dismissals.*
- *Make sure that homework is completed.*
- *Monitor the amount of television their children watch.*
- *Volunteer in your child’s classroom.*
- *Be an active participant in decisions pertaining to your child’s education.*
- *Promote positive use of your child’s extracurricular time.*
- *Read all notices from the school or the school district received from your child or via mail.*
- *Serve on advisory groups, such as Title I advisory committees and parental involvement committees.*
- *Parents are encouraged to volunteer a minimum of 1 hour a semester in individual classrooms. Arrangements must be made in advance to volunteer. Parents are not allowed to observe their child in class due to behavioral problems.*

Student Responsibilities

As a student, I will share the responsibility to improve my academic achievement and achieve the State’s high standards. Specifically, I will:

- *Do my homework every day.*
- *Master grade appropriate sight words.*
- *Master addition/subtraction facts (K-2nd) multiplication facts (3rd—5th).*
- *Read at least 30 minutes every day outside of school time.*
- *Give to my parents or the adult who is responsible for my welfare all notices and information received by me from my school every day.*
- *Refrain from bullying.*
- *Implement the teachings of our Leinkauf Student Houses.*
