

The High-Flier and Leader Scholarship Application

Merriam-Webster defines high-flier as “someone who is an ambitiously competitive person with high aspirations” and a leader as “a person who has commanding authority or influence.” This \$500 non-renewable scholarship will be awarded to the Veterans High School student who most exhibited these characteristics in high school and demonstrates the potential to continue making their positive contributions in college and beyond.

1. Minimum scholarship academic requirements are:
 - a. 3.5 unweighted high school GPA or higher
 - b. 1060 composite SAT score or higher or,
 - c. 22 composite ACT score or higher

2. Extra-curricular participation in any of the following is a requirement:
 - a. Varsity sports
 - b. Sanctioned school club or activity (CTAE, robotics, etc.)
 - c. AFJROTC
 - d. Band or drama competition team
 - e. Student government
 - f. Boy Scouts or Girl Scouts

3. Please include a typed (Times New Roman, 12 font, double-spaced) 500-word essay on why you think it is important to make positive contributions to an organization and society in general.
