Happy Mother's Day! I hope that all Mothers and Grandmothers are well honored and doted on this day especially, and year-round.

Our society is devolving, but thankfully that seems to be slowing down. We see the gender confusion to the point of absurdity. Recently, I read a story of a well-known transgender athlete state that he was born a woman, lived as a woman, and is a woman. If a male who self-identifies as a woman can make such a statement, then the question must be asked, "What is woman?"

The Church has had a clear answer to that, one that is based in


The Church has had a clear answer to that, one that is based in reason (science) and faith. A woman is a human with the capacity to produce eggs with the requisite body parts to allow for the conception, implantation and development of the newly conceived life. Some women may lack the ability to ovulate – either due to disfunction or disease, but their gender is not a matter of self-identification. It is rooted in the DNA – they have XY chromosomes – and in the body. Self-identification is important, but it cannot change reality.

That is why a holiday like Mother's Day is so important. It declares that there is something unique about mothers. They are the ones that bear and nurture children, in their wombs and continuing well outside of the womb. While we might thank God for the motherly women in our life (and I do thank God for all of them in my life), a mother is irreplaceable. The same is true of fathers – they too are unique, and I thank God for them, too. This weekend is a stark reminder to our culture of the unique role of women.

At the time of my writing this, we are still within the conclave. No matter, I have a prayer: My hope and prayer for the newly elected Pope is that he would have a strong, clear voice for reason and faith, helping to encourage the faith and lead society to truth. May the Holy Spirit guide and encourage him. May he hold on to the best of our recent popes and speak with a bold clarity the faith that we send to

the peripheries to share the Good News of Jesus Christ.

INFORMATION REGARDING SCHEDULING DURING THE ST. EDWARD RENOVATION

The Mass schedule will change during the St. Edward renovation. *This will begin on Monday, May 19*.

All weekday Masses will be at the convent. Watch the bulletin for time changes but they will usually be at 12:00 pm. There will be NO weekday Masses at St. Ed's.

The Saturday 5:30 pm Masses will be held at St. Eloi. The scheduled liturgists from St. Ed's will be covering all liturgy positions. Again, if you cannot be at the Mass where you're scheduled with a duty, please find your replacement.

The Sunday 8:30 am Masses will be held in the St. Edward basement. Again, the scheduled liturgist's will be responsible for being there. You will begin in the sacristy and receive directions from Father and the Deacon at that time.

The pews will be removed from the sanctuary and taken away to be refinished. The flooring will be replaced with tile so all carpet and current tile will be removed. The ceiling will be patched, and the walls and ceiling will be painted.

Over the arch the words, "Credo videre bona Domini in terra viventium" will be painted in Latin. This means "I hope to see the good things of the Lord in the land of the living." This is a verse from Psalm 26:13 and is thought to be one of the last words of St. Edward the Confessor, our patron saint.
