Course Description:

Welcome to 10th Grade World Literature! This course prepares you for reading and writing not only in future classes but in the world beyond, such as in the workforce, day-to-day conversation, and more. We will build on what you learned in 9th grade ELA and prepare you for the rigor of 11th grade American Lit. By the end of the year, students should be able to analyze the various aspects of literature and poetry such as themes, characters, elements, literary devices, poetic devices, and use these things in various conventions of writing.

Make-up/Late Work:

- ★ Late work (unexcused absence/late turn-in) results in a 10% reduction of the work completed.
- ★ All work must be turned in during the month in which it is assigned. After the month is over, the assignment will remain a zero.
- ★ If effort is given on an assignment, the minimum grade will be 50% of total points.
- ★ If work is not turned in OR it is evident that effort was not given, then the assignment will be marked as "missing" or a "0."
- ★ A note on cheating/ plagiarizing: Cheating/ plagiarizing will be counted as a zero, and you will have the opportunity to redo the assignment. Some points are always better than no points (even if you don't finish an assignment).
 - **This includes and extends to the unauthorized use of AI for classroom assignments.**

Leaving Class:

Students are expected to take care of as much out-of-class business as possible during class change. As per the Villa Rica High School wide policy, students are not allowed to leave class during the first 15 minutes of class, or the last 10 minutes of class.
