

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Kindergarten

Mrs. Tinnin

This week, Kindergarteners are learning about the letters 'm' and 'a'. We started learning sight words beginning with the word 'l'. We continue to practice identifying the sounds in words. Students are very good at identifying the beginning sounds but need to practice ending sounds. To help with this at home, parents can pick simple words like 'bat'. Practice identifying the beginning sounds and ending sounds.

In math, we are learning about different ways to make 6. We will continue with the numbers 7-10. We are also practicing how to write our numbers correctly with our number poems to help us. Students know the poems 0-6 very well.

We read Socks for Supper, Three Little Kittens, and Jamaica's Find. Students are learning different Nursery Rhymes: Little Miss Muffet, One, Two Buckle my Shoe, Star Light, Star Bright and a couple of others. One of our

focus points during Listen and Learn is to listen for the rhyming words in the Nursery Rhymes. I am impressed with how fast they are learning the rhymes. They like to say them in class.

First and Second Grade Explorers Mrs. Mittge

1st grade Explorers are deep into their subtraction math unit. 2nd graders continue to build three-digit number sense. Any time families can spend on reinforcing these skills through talk or games would benefit students. Here is an online resource: https://knp.kentuckymathematics.org/family/online_act.php

Students are working hard to segment and blend sounds into words and to use "text diving" to find evidence in text to support answers and thinking. 2nd graders are beginning to write responses in complete sentences. All students are doing such a wonderful job taking AR tests! Please continue to read aloud with your child for 20 minutes every night. This makes such a difference in their reading fluency and reading comprehension. It also gives families a chance to have a sweet, calm moment together each night.

Explorers are continuing a study on Earth materials. Rocks will be our focus for the next couple of weeks. This weekend take a nature walk. Collect some rocks and leaves. We'll share on Monday. Happy nature walking!



Third and Fourth Grade Classroom Ms. Turnquist

This week we dove into our science curriculum. All month students will be learning about Earth and space systems. This week students brainstormed what they know and what they want to know about these systems. Students were then able to pick a partner and research a planet. They used their research to create a poster all about their planet before presenting to the class.







<u>Fifth and Sixth Grade Classroom</u>

This week we continued to traverse our way through the math curriculum. 5th grade is learning all about division and multiple ways to accomplish multiple digit division and 6th grade is refining their abilities with multiplying and dividing fractions. Both grades are doing a great job working with these concepts! In ELA, 5th grade has moved from learning about prepositions to learning about verbs and verb tenses as well as continuing through their study of early American civilizations. 6th grade is about halfway through

6th grade is about halfway through Percy Jackson and are now combining ancient Greek mythology study with their Percy Jackson study. They will soon be writing a compare and contrast essay on three different myths from the ancient Greeks.
