Attendance Policy

- Students in grades 9-12 who have accumulated more than (5) unexcused absences will be in jeopardy of not receiving credits
- **Every** absence will require an independent excuse

Honor and Superior Honor Graduates

- **Honor Graduates**

- 90 or better cumulative average

- **Superior Honor Graduates**

- 95 or better cumulative average
- Academic Pathway
 - **Requirements**
 - Earn four credits in one academic subject area
 - One of those credits must be an AP course or a DE course
 - Plus two credits of Foreign Language

Differences in GPA

- HOPE GPA is calculated by using **Core Academics** plus **Foreign Language**
 - Math, Science, Social Studies, English and Foreign Language
 - Electives **DO NOT** count
 - CTAE course that count as a science credit **is calculated into your HOPE GPA**
 - Any **extra points** that are added by the school AP(5), De(4)Honors(3) **are deducted (.5 added back for DE & AP)**
 - **See your HOPE GPA through your GAFutures account**
- High School GPA is calculated using all types of credits
 - Math, Science, Social Studies, English and Foreign Language
 - Electives **DO** count

HOPE GPA

- HOPE only calculates *Core Academics* plus *Foreign Language*
- Electives **DO NOT** count
- Must have a 3.0 Hope GPA to be eligible for **Hope Scholarship**.
- Hope GPA of 3.7 for **Zell Miller** and score at least 1200 on SAT in one test session or 26 composite on ACT; Valedictorian and Salutatorian are automatic Zell Miller recipients
- **HOPE Career GRANT**: high school diploma and maintain 2.0

Dual Enrollment academic courses

- **Must take a minimum of 4 Rigor courses to be HOPE eligible in the following types of courses:**

- Advanced Math courses
- Advanced Science courses
- AP courses in core areas
- Dual Enrollment Courses
- Advanced foreign language courses

HOPE/Honors, DE, & AP Classes

- Honors (3), DE (4) and AP (5) Classes receive additional points towards your High School Core GPA
- Please remember that HOPE does NOT honor those points. However, for AP and DE courses GSFC will add a 0.5 to the grade...up to a 4.0
- Once these points are removed it **CAN** keep you from receiving HOPE

SAT, ACT & ASVAB Test Prep Resources

- Khan Academy is another online test prep resource that is free for SAT
- SAT and ACT Prep Materials are also available in the library
- USA Test Prep
- Edmentum (come to the CPC to sign up)

STAR Student

- Take the two-part SAT on any national testing date.
- Score highest on any single test date (scores may not be combined from two or more test dates).
- At the end of Junior year, based on GPA, must be in the top 10% of the class.
- If the student with the highest SAT score does not meet the top 10 criterion, the student with the next highest SAT score who does meet the criterion becomes the nominee.

College Applications Process

- Submit applications **ASAP**
 - All colleges have different deadlines
 - Request an unofficial transcript
 - May need a Letter of Recommendation
 - Fill out & RETURN a Senior Brag Sheet a week prior to deadline
- Immunizations
 - Required form
 - May have to get shots
- Proof of Residence
 - Driver's license
- Apply for housing
- **Send a final official high school transcript.**
 - After graduation
 - Must let Registrar know where to send it.
 - Request for DE transcripts to be sent to your college choice(s)

Local Scholarships

- **Required Documentation**
 - Scholarship Application
 - College letter of Acceptance
 - Two community letters of recommendation
 - Two teacher letters of recommendation
 - Transcript **WITH** SAT or ACT scores
- **Additional Requirements**
 - Completed FAFSA
 - Cumulative GPA of 2.5
- **Jan 28- Local scholarship application posted online**
- **Feb 28- Applications due to CPC**

Scholastic Jackets

- To earn a Scholastic Jacket, students must have a 90 cumulative average through the first semester of their senior year.
- Earning a jacket does **not** automatically qualify you as an honor graduate.
- If you meet this criteria you will be notified by the CPC.

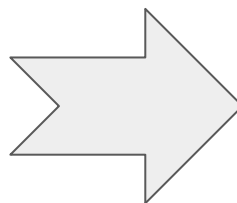
- Nov 20th - all DE applications must be completed for Spring enrollment.
