School Responsibilities

Grand Bay Middle will:

- 1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:
 - Students will be taught necessary concepts in an aligned curriculum
 - Teachers will use test data to drive instruction in the classroom
 - Students scoring below proficiency on standardized tests will be scheduled for remediation classes in the areas of reading or math
- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences:
 - Will be held at times convenient for the parent to attend and all conferences will be completed by the end of second semester
 - Will involve/include parents in Statewide Parenting Day activities at the local school
 - Partnership conferences available on Parenting Day or specific time of parent's request
- 3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:
 - Progress reports for all students will be available at each mid quarter marking
 - Report cards will be sent home at the conclusion of each quarter
 - Student progress can be monitored by the online parent portal
- 4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:
 - Staff will be available throughout the year (by appointment) to meet with parents during planning time. Appointments can be scheduled by calling the school registrar at 251-865-6511
 - Teachers will provide a syllabus to the parents noting their scheduled planning periods in which conferences may be scheduled
- 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:
 - Parents may schedule volunteer hours with individual teachers and/or school personnel
 - Parents are given opportunities to volunteer in various capacities
- 6. Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable in a language that family members can understand.
 - Parents/teacher communication occurs a number of ways: phone calls, emails, written notes, social media, messenger and conferences. To ensure the family understands documentation and communication, Trans Act can be used to translate as requested.
