

Who should get meningococcal vaccines?

MenACWY:

- Preteens 11-12 years
- Teens aged 16 years (booster dose)

MenB:

- Anyone 10 years and older who is at increased risk
- Anyone 16 through 23 years (preferably at ages 16 through 18 years) may receive MenB in addition to MenACWY.

MenABCWY:

- Anyone 10 years and older who needs MenACWY and MenB at the same visit.



N.J.A.C. 8:57-4 requires 11-year-olds attending school at Grade 6 and higher to provide evidence of receiving meningococcal vaccine (MenACWY).

N.J.S.A. 18A:62-15.1 requires students in institutions of higher education to receive meningococcal vaccination as a condition of attendance.

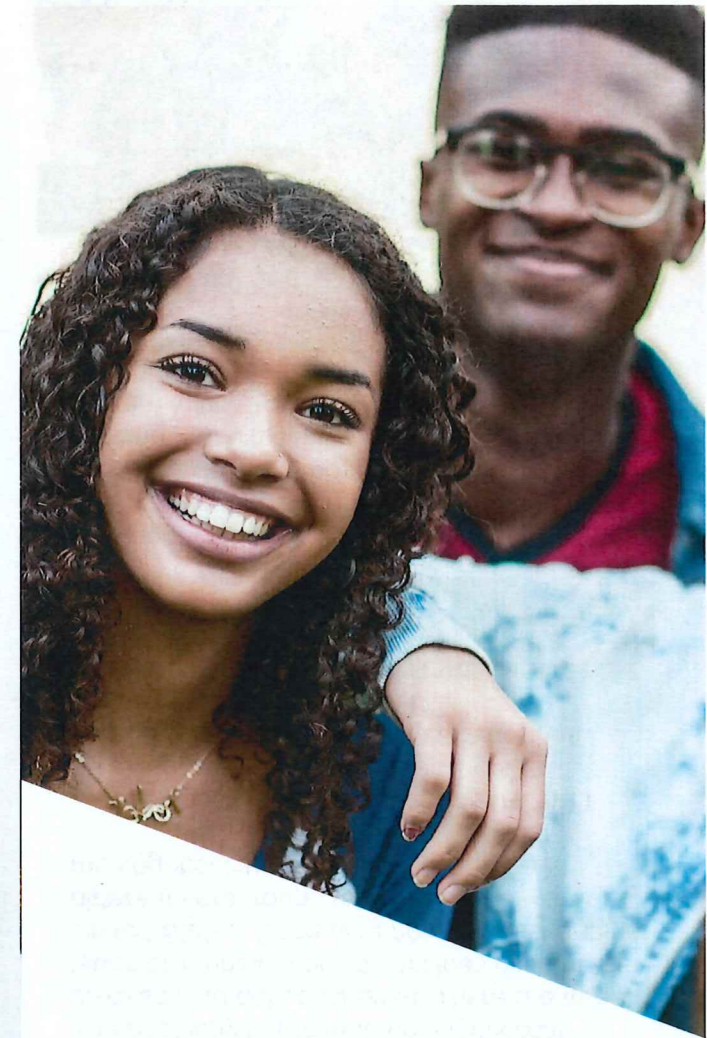
