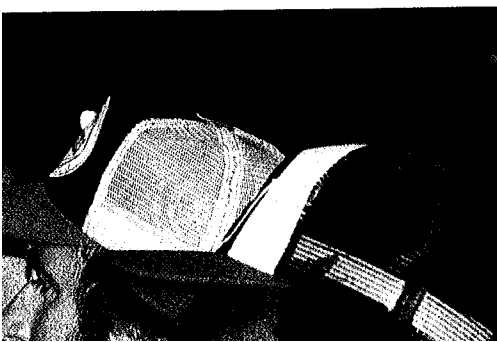

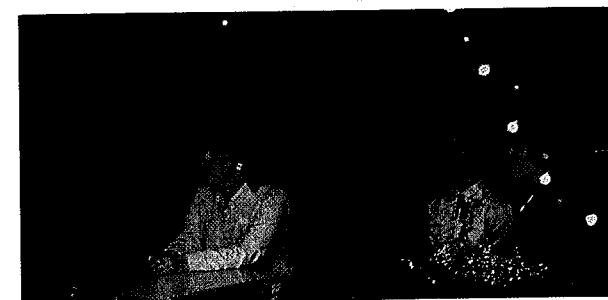
Great Times

The Talent but Not the Touch

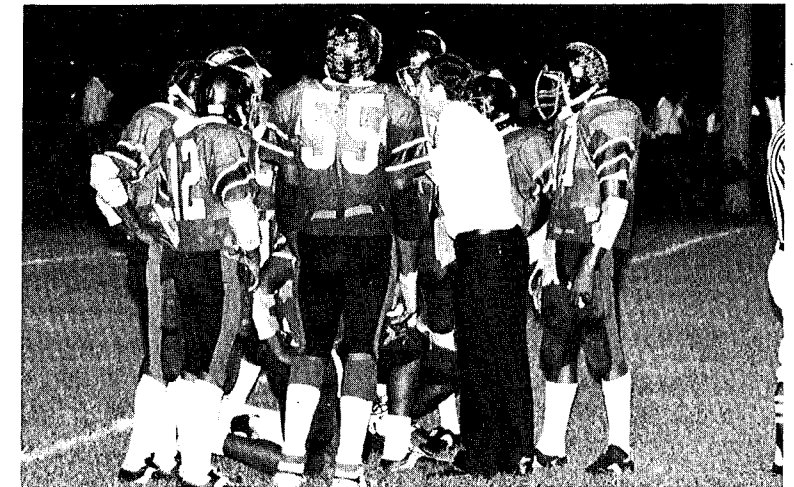

Freshmen Fight Tough

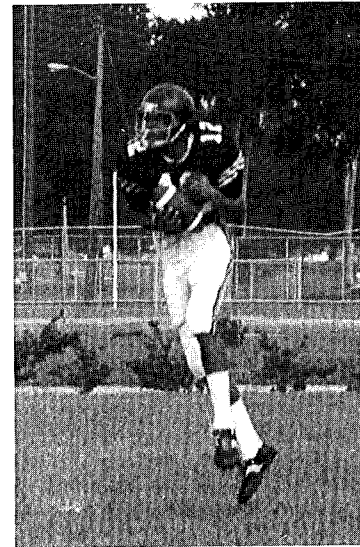

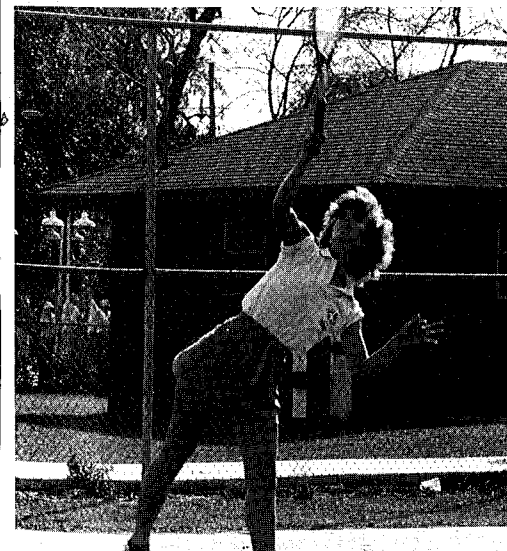

Swim Team Makes Big Splash

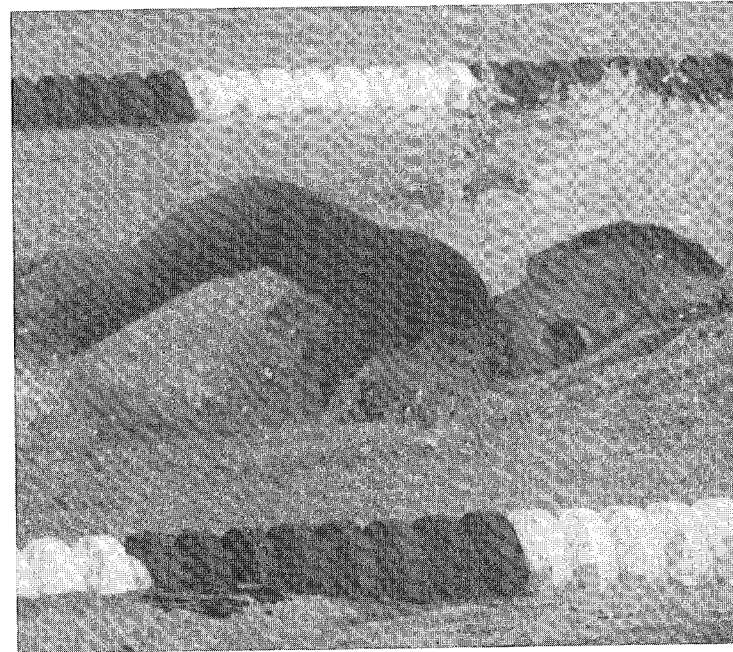

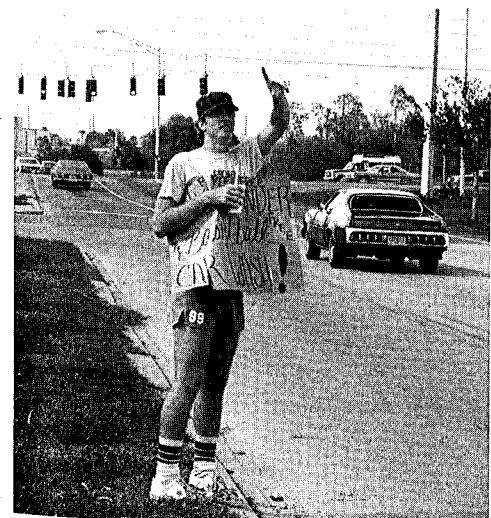

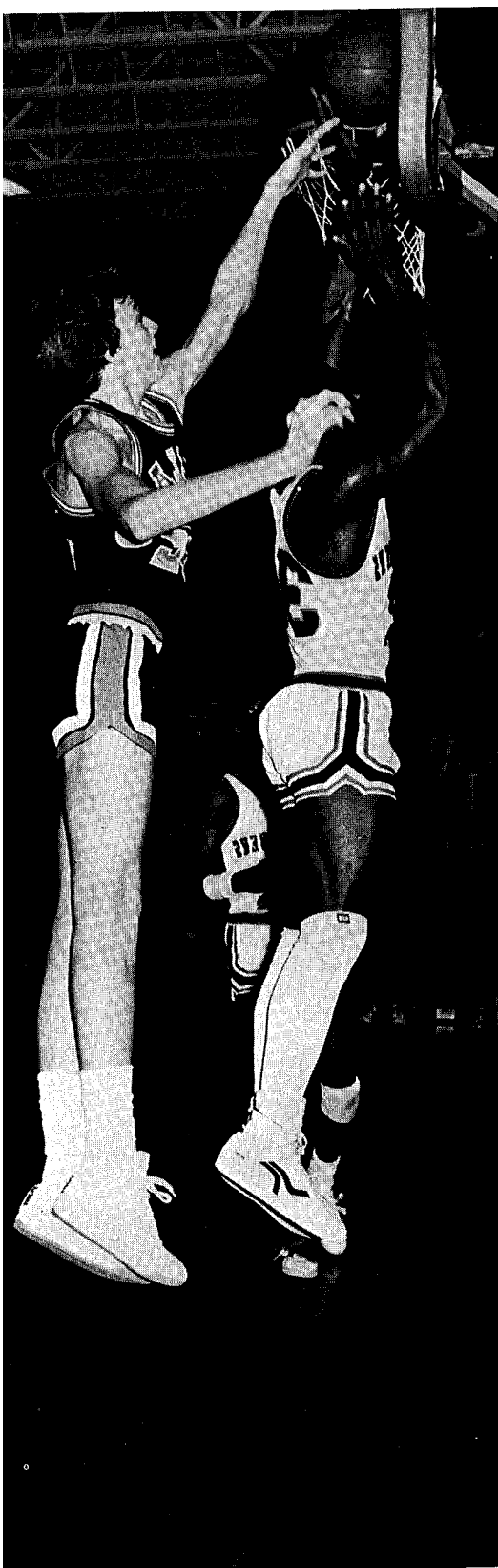
The Best of Times: The Worst of Times

The Lake Wales High School Basketball Team of 1983-84 played one of its toughest schedules in recent history. The team was led by All-American performer Roland Chadwick, who led the team in goal and rebound percentages.

Seniors Demetrias Wilson and Albert Kirkland added depth to the Highlander shooting attack with their consistent outside shooting.

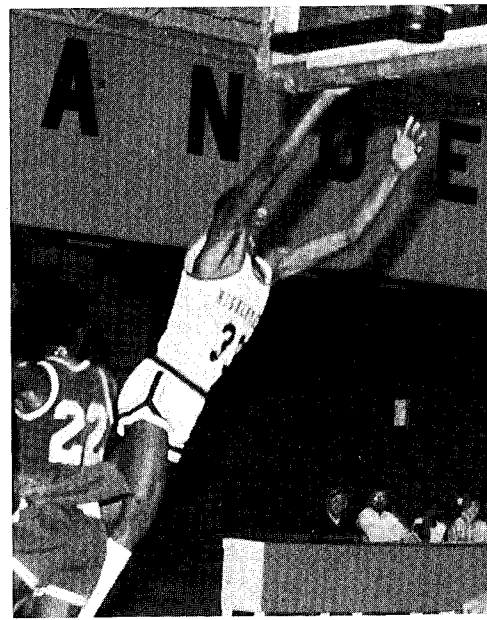

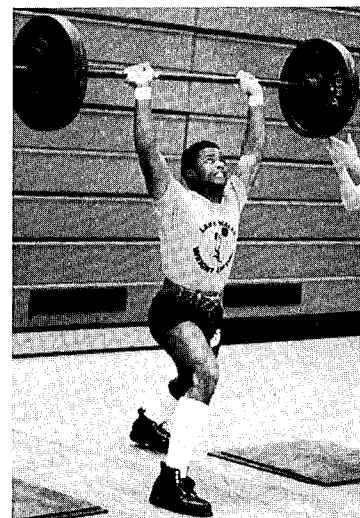
Weightlifters Do It Again!

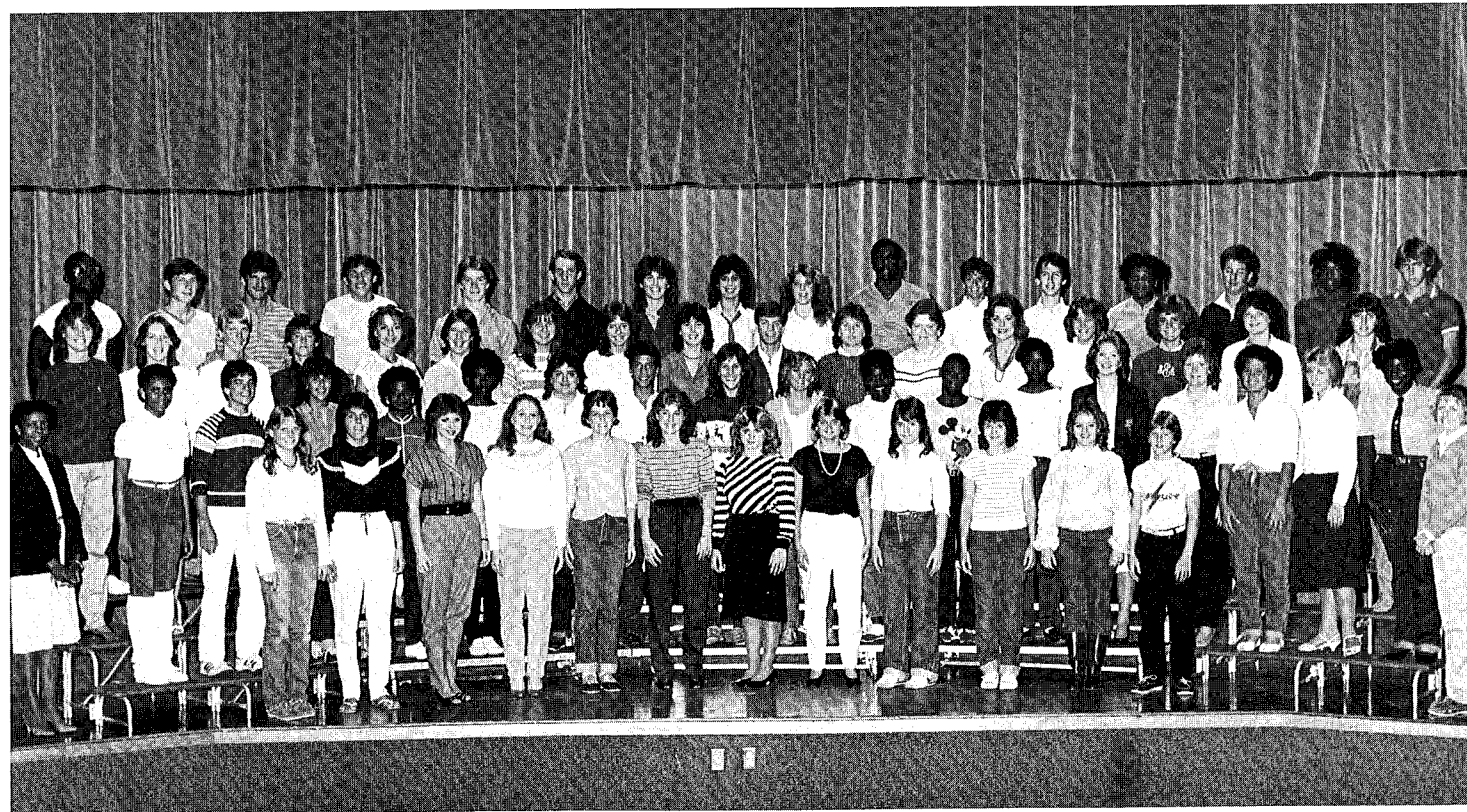


Student Council Tops the Year With Topper Day

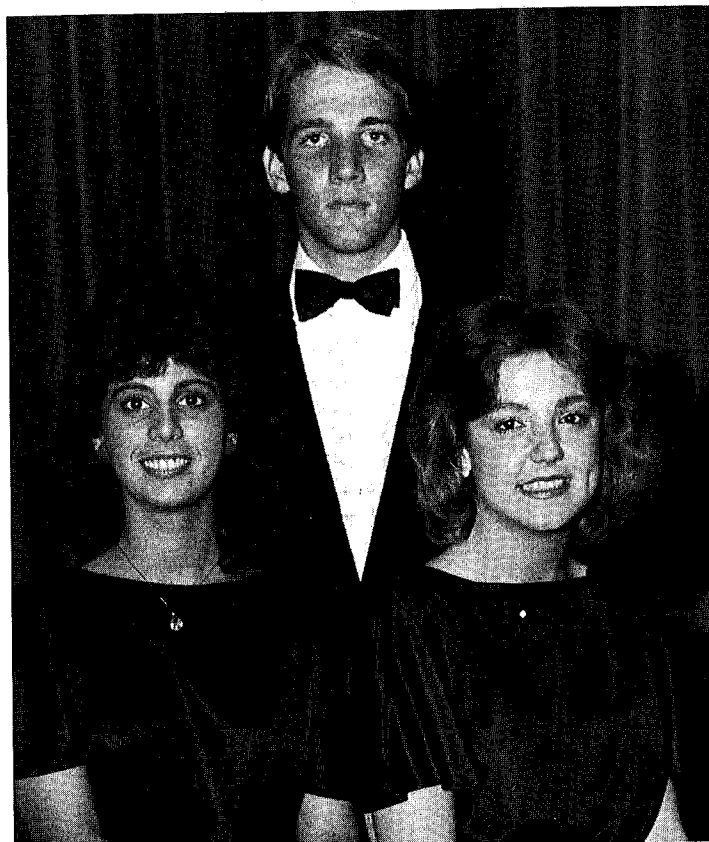

New Director Leads Chorus to State

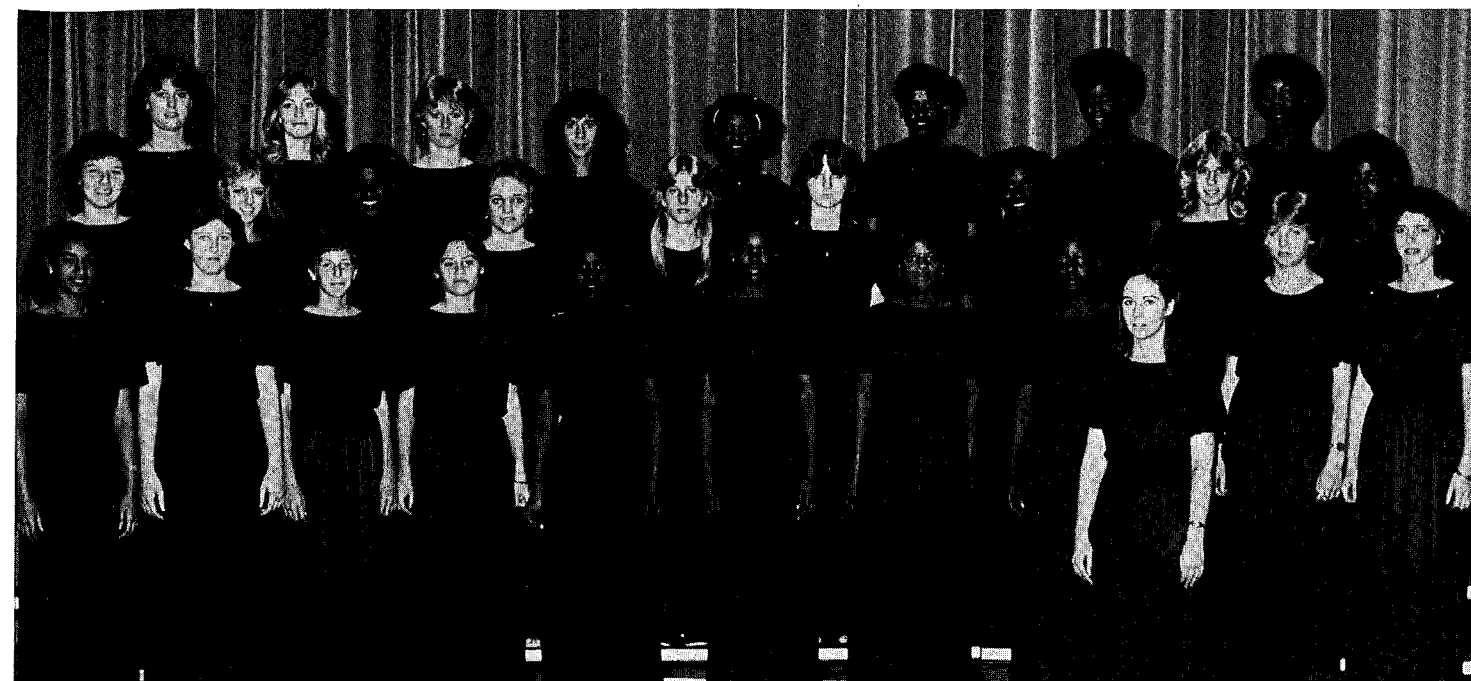

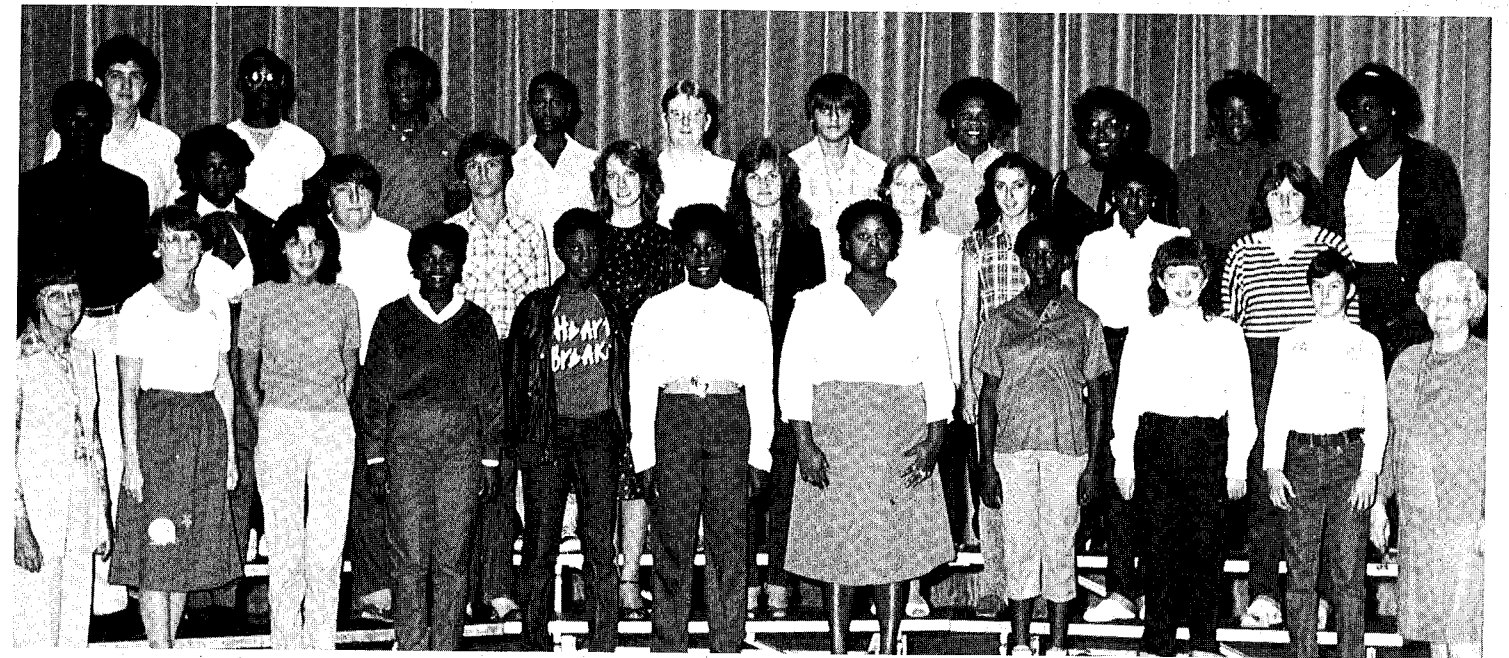

National Honor Society Inducts New Members

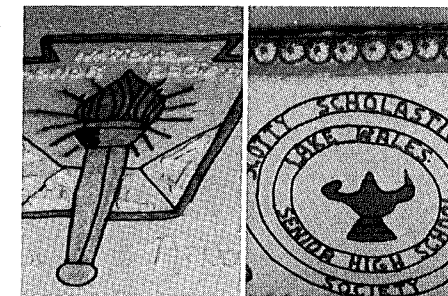

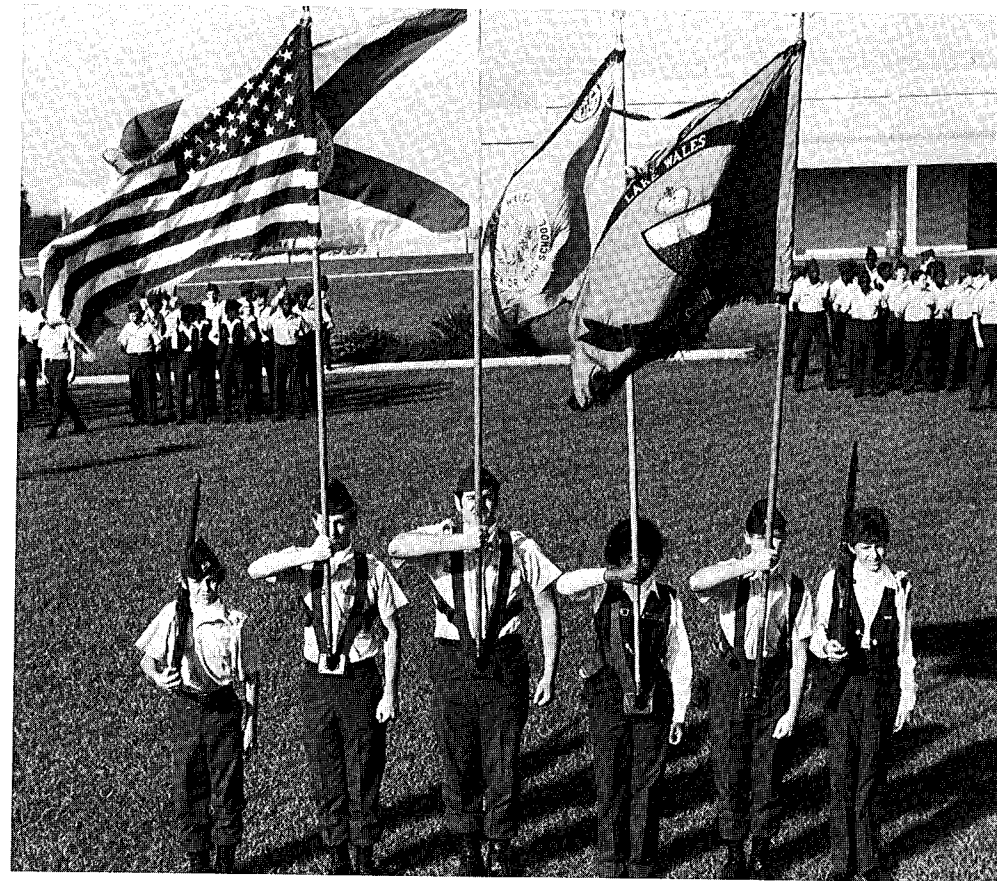

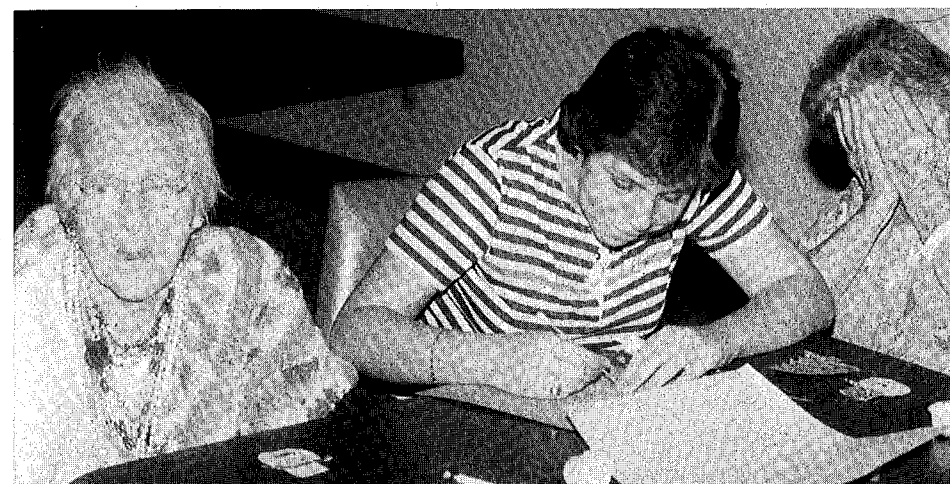
