TK and Kindergarten

Mrs. Tinnin

This week, Kindergarten students focused on the letters x, j, r, and y. They are practicing the use of finger spaces in their writing and illustrating pictures that correspond with their written phrases. In math, students are working on addition using manipulatives to identify number pairs that make a given whole. They are also learning to read simple number sentences and determine the missing addend.

TK students enjoyed listening to classic stories such as *The Gingerbread Man* and *The Shoemaker and the Elves*. They are continuing to learn the letters in their names and practice writing them. In language development, students are also working on counting syllables in words. In math, TK students explored the numbers 6 through 9 by practicing the concept of adding one more using hands-on materials.

Both TK and Kindergarten students are developing their understanding of patterns and rhyming. Kindergarteners are learning to recognize and name patterns, while TK students are focusing on identifying patterns.


Third and Fourth Grade Classroom

Families, we have swim lessons next week! I have found the experience runs much more smoothly if students **come to** school wearing their swim wear UNDER their school clothes.

Please send your child to school next week with the following:

- 1. Swim wear UNDER their school clothes;
- 2. A plastic bag with their name on it;
- 3. A towel in the plastic bag;
- 4. A change of under garments in their plastic bag;
- 5. An extra pair of socks in their plastic bag.

I have also found that goggles end up not being used by students. They get lost and/or broken. I would not recommend bringing swim goggles.

Please help your child place their swim gear in their backpacks each day. We will need to leave promptly at 12:20 each afternoon and return just before the end of the school day.

Last, students have done a wonderful job of memorizing their lines for the play! PLEASE CONTINUE TO PRACTICE LINES AT HOME. Students need to practice saying their lines with expression and projecting their voices without yelling. They also need to know when to say their lines without prompting in the context of the play's action.
