Why TISD and THS are AWESOME!

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- **It is possible to graduate with an Associates Degree.***
 - * If the student and parents want the student to take more courses than what THS offers, it is possible and the student will receive the TISD cost, but will need to pay for the tuition themselves. Therefore, it is possible to graduate with additional hours at your cost.
- **TISD pays for the courses taken at THS!!!***
 - Students must pass the class with a C or better. If a student drops the course before the end of the semester or fails the course, then the student will be responsible to reimburse TISD the cost of the course.

TISD's cost for college courses

- **Currently**, Panola offers Dual Credit courses for \$50 per semester hour, \$15 per semester hour for professors, and \$25 base cost for an electric Math textbook.
 - If a THS staff member teaches the course, the total cost is \$150 - (\$50 x 3 hours)
 - If a Panola College staff member teaches the course, the total cost is \$195 - [(\$50 x 3 hours) + (\$15 x 3 hours)]
 - Math 1314 & 1342 are taught by a PC staff member and requires an online textbook, therefore (\$50 x 3 hours) + (\$15 x 3 hours) + (\$25 textbook) = \$220
 - Math 2413 & 2413 are taught by a PC staff member and also requires an online textbook... However, these courses have a lab attached, therefore they are 4 college hours and the price increases to: (\$50 x 4 hours) + (\$15 x 4 hours) + (\$25 textbook) = \$285
- Obviously, the costs may differ from year to year due to the college increasing their tuition and fees. TISD signs a new Memorandum of Understanding with Panola every year.

Prerequisites to taking a Dual Credit class

- **Must make at least a 4000 on their English II EOC**
- **Must make at least a 4000 on their Algebra I EOC**
 - These scores allow the college to WAIVE the TSI exam. Students become TSI - EXEMPT when they complete and pass a college Math and English course.


OR

- **Must take the TSI test and make . . . (THS offers throughout the year):**
 - 950 or higher on the Mathematics portion (*exception: less than 950 but a 6 or higher on the diagnostic portion)
 - 945 or higher on the English Language Arts & Reading portion and a 5 or higher on the essay portion (*exception: less than 945 but a 4 or higher on the diagnostic portion. OR less than a 5 on the essay and a diagnostic writing level of 5 or higher)

Alternative ways to be TSI exempt/waived

- Make a 510 on the Math portion and a 460 on the Reading portion of the **PSAT** (this is a waiver, not an exemption).
- **Make a combined score of a 40 on the English & Reading portions and make a 22 on the Math portion on the **ACT**.** (exempt)
- Make a 480 on the Reading and Writing portions and a 530 on the Math portions of the **SAT**. (exempt)

- **Government 2305** - Prerequisite: TSI ELAR (or waiver)

- **English 1302** - Prerequisite: ENGL 1301
- **English 2322**- Prerequisite: ENGL 1301 and ENGL 1302
- **College Algebra (Math 1314)** - Prerequisites: TSI Math (or waiver) + Alg. 2 completion
- **Statistics (Math 1342)** - Prerequisites: TSI Math (or waiver) + Alg. 2 completion
- *****PreCalculus (Math 2412)** -Prerequisites: Two years of high school Algebra, one year of high school Geometry and TSI Math
- *****Calculus (Math 2413)** - Prerequisite: Math 2412

Class Requirements

- **This varies by course and sometimes by professor.**
 - **Some courses require the student to purchase a textbook or electronic textbook. This cost is usually NOT covered by THS, therefore the student will need to cover that cost.**
 - **A syllabus is provided to the student at the beginning of the course, and due dates are non-negotiable. The student will need to make sure they are taking care of that course work in an appropriate time frame.**

Being a College Student

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- As a college student, the college professors (either on campus or online) are not obligated to contact parents if a student is falling behind or failing their class. In fact, they **will not** do this. It is suggested that parents of dual credit students periodically have their child sign into their class and show them the course grade.
- Dual Credit course grades are not reported on any report card or progress report sent by the school until the end of the semester. The final grade will only appear as a semester grade on the students' transcripts.

SB1231

SB 1231 enacted by the Texas Legislature limits the number of classes a student may drop. Under section 51.907 of the Texas Education Code, "an institution of higher education may not permit a student to drop more than six courses, including any course a transfer student has dropped at another institution of higher education." This statute was enacted by the State of Texas in spring 2007 and applies to students who enroll in a public institution of higher education as first-time freshmen in fall 2007 or later.

- No exemption requested
- A severe illness or debilitating condition
- Caregiver
- The death of a family member
- Active duty service of National Guard or Armed Forces
- The uncontrollable change of student's work schedule
- Other good cause as determined by the institution

Dual Credit and GPAs

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- Please be aware that just because a student takes dual credit courses does not mean that their GPA will go up OR that the student will automatically be in the top 10% or first quartile in class rank.
- **GPA is a numbers game.**
 - A 90 in a regular class is a 90 when calculating GPA
 - A 90 in a dual credit or honors class is a 99 when calculating GPA
 - **HOWEVER**, an 80 in a dual credit or honors class is an 88 when calculating GPA.
