Dear Parishioners,

The great season of Lent has started. As it is a season of prayer and fasting, it is a good time to reflect on our lives and our faith. As I continue to deal with the financial aspects of my mother's death, I am becoming aware of something I simply did without deeply contemplating the spiritual impact of it, and that was writing her obituary. It was difficult to sum up her life in a few words, giving those that knew her a sense of the fullness of her life beyond the perhaps narrow view they had, and leaving a written legacy of her. But also, one that reminded me that someday someone will be writing mine. What do I want them to write about me? What gifts do I offer, and what failings do I have that will leave an imprint on those who mourn or celebrate my death?

With that, I recalled that there are several saints who suggest writing your own obituary. Taking an honest look at our lives in this spiritual exercise, trying to summarize a life of hobbies, interests, study, work, relationships, faith, helps bring clarity. In addition, if there is something we don't like, we have time to change what we write. What I mean by this is that, if for example, we find we would like to be generous but aren't currently, we can start to live more generously. What do we want to be remembered for? What vices would we rather not have to list, and with the time remaining, and God's grace, seek to eliminate. We remember that our lives are so much more than a few words on the pages, but while we have breath, we have the ability to change what will be written when we breath our last. While there is still time, we are invited to love the Lord more fully.

In the Gospel for this weekend, we hear the of the temptation of Jesus. We need to remember that temptation is not necessarily a sin, unless we are feeding that temptation by what we consume in media or failing to properly form our minds and conscience. Jesus Christ experienced temptation as an external thing, and we can be tempted both externally (by the evil one, society, media, or others) or internally because of concupiscence – a brokenness that leads to disordered desires. This Lenten season, in addition to remembering that we are going to die, we also call to mind the way we are living. Seeking to avoid temptation and the near occasions of sin, we will live Lent well.
