GREATLY TO BE PRAISED

Dear Parishioners,

Thank you to all who worked, donated toward, and attended the festival at St. Edward's last week. Weather-wise, it was perfect, and everything else seemed to be even better. While I was not able to enjoy the meal immediately, it was good the next day.

Monday I had the colonoscopy. At this time, there is nothing to report. The nurses did say that the doctor did not see anything new or obvious, but that pathology will take some time to make their report. I will admit that I was hoping that they would find a cause for the stomach issues that I have had – the two conditions that they are aware of colitis (inflammation of the colon lining) and diverticulosis (pockets in the colon) do not explain the symptoms.

All the same, this is good news. The doctor I go to for this in Mankato is excellent and I have had at least four colonoscopies and one upper endoscopy with him. He is thorough and personable, and typically gets backed up – he was only 90 minutes behind this time. As I remind his staff when they apologize, I know that he is not purposely behind, and besides, I am prepped and that is the worst part of the procedure (if you know, you know!). Why go home and start all over? I am willing to wait, knowing that he is doing his job and giving each patient the time they need, especially because what often gets him delayed is finding polyps, cancers, and other major issues. I would rather wait and hear that things are okay with me, praying for those that are facing serious issues, than be told that $\hat{\bf I}$ have something serious, but the doctor did not want to take the time to fully address the issue because he did not want to be delayed. Not that I am a perfect model, but I do think that this attitude of acceptance is very much needed in our day. A little kindness and

understanding goes a long way.

This Sunday evening, September 24, we will host an hour of Adoration and confessions at St. Eloi at 7 pm. All are welcome to attend. We are going to schedule more of these this year shortly. We also offer Adoration on Thursdays 5-7 pm most Thursdays and 6:30-7:30 pm on Wednesdays when there is RE. This time is for silent prayer and adoration. These times are offered to you for your prayer. While stopping and praying in church is always good for the soul, spending time in Adoration when our Eucharistic Lord is exposed for our prayer is helpful to contemplate the reality of our Lord's Presence. Please make use of these offerings.

For those that can, I remind you that Holy Redeemer offers almost perpetual Adoration in the Chapel attached to their school. You can contact them about arranging a time, and they do have it for those that find it conducive to pray during the night as well.
