- 1. 2. If there is not space on this page sufficient to contain the names of all the children in the district, write the remainder upon ordinary foolscap paper, properly ruled, and attach the same to this sheet. Do not use additional blanks.
3. The ages of the children must be given as they are on June 1, 1913. If a child removes from the district during the fifteen days preceding June 1, he should be enrolled in the district in which he is resident June 1.
4. Place opposite the names of pupils enrolled in 7th or 8th grade in the column provided, the number of grade in which they are enrolled. The total must agree with items 2a and 2b, front of blank.
