Spring Maps Celebrations

We took the MAPs test back in March. It feels like longer. When we looked at the scores from Fall to Spring, the students well exceeded what the county expected.

Fall to Spring 2024:

1st grade: Math 99% growth 2nd grade: Math 93% growth 5th grade: Reading 90% growth

1st and 2nd grade, there was a math focus. Due to the revisions of the standards, it was more difficult because they were looking at changes. 5th grade had huge growth in reading. They really worked with those students. They took the Map test right before Spring Break. Then they revamped small groups for AO Time remediation. They looked at what standard to really focus on within the Essential Standards. Kindergarten did fabulous, too. They were not part of this but were exposed to it and practiced it. They took it in small groups so that they did not just click. They are ready for first grade.

They are going to invite them back for next school year. There was a poster contest for 3rd to 5th grade. The teachers voted. The kids did a great job.
