April Strevig started the meeting with the pledge. She then opened the meeting and welcomed everyone.

The agenda for the meeting was reviewed. Bobby Jones then made a motion to approve the agenda. Tiffany Branson seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

The minutes of the February meeting were reviewed. Tara Hill then made a motion to approve the agenda. Bobby Jones seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous and the motion carried.

Dr. Strevig introduced Dr. Sonya Kiefer as the new principal of Lake Joy Primary.

Dr. April Strevig gave an update on our School Improvement Plan and Instructional Updates. Our schools recently received the growth information from the Fall to Spring assessments for MAP. In first grade, the students scored in the 82nd%tile in reading. These students fell in the 83rd%tile for conditional growth. In Math, first grade scored in the 87th%tile and the 94th%tile for growth. In second grade, our students scored in the 79th%tile and the 99th%tile in growth for reading. The second graders scored in the 86th%tile and the 99th%tile for growth in Math. LJPS continues to focus on the standards and teach per standard per student.

April continued our discussion regarding the 4 PLC questions that are guiding all of our meetings and decisions made at the school and county level. They are: What do we want our students to learn? (Essential Standards), How will we know if each student has learned it? (Common Formative Assessments), How we will respond when some students do not learn it? (Response to Intervention and Academic Opportunity Time), and How will we extend and enrich the learning for students who have demonstrated proficiency? (Enrichments during Academic Opportunity Time). Specifically, we addressed questions #3 and #4 with our Academic Opportunity Time and Response to Interventions. Our tutoring program ended in March, and some of these same students have been offered Summer Learning Academy Invitations. These students are "bubble" students that need an extra push to meet the standards. Teachers continue to use i-Ready and the Learning Continuum to provide targeted instruction for participants. We are also working on our Early Intervention rubrics to organize classes for next year so that all students are receiving a quality education. Teachers continue to enrichment activities in class as well by collaborating with our gifted certified teachers and providing small group and AO time enrichment.

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We are collecting the final rounds of data through running records, record of progress, and Essential standards checklists. We are also looking at WSO (PK), GKIDS (Kindergarten), and the final MAP fluency assessments. We have also administered the Bracken on all Pre-K students

Dr. Strevig shared that our Covid protocols have ended and our building is almost back to pre Covid practices.

With no additional discussions, a motion to adjourn was made by Candice Scott. Chris Bentley seconded the motion and the meeting was adjourned.

We will have elections for council members on April 28, 2022.
