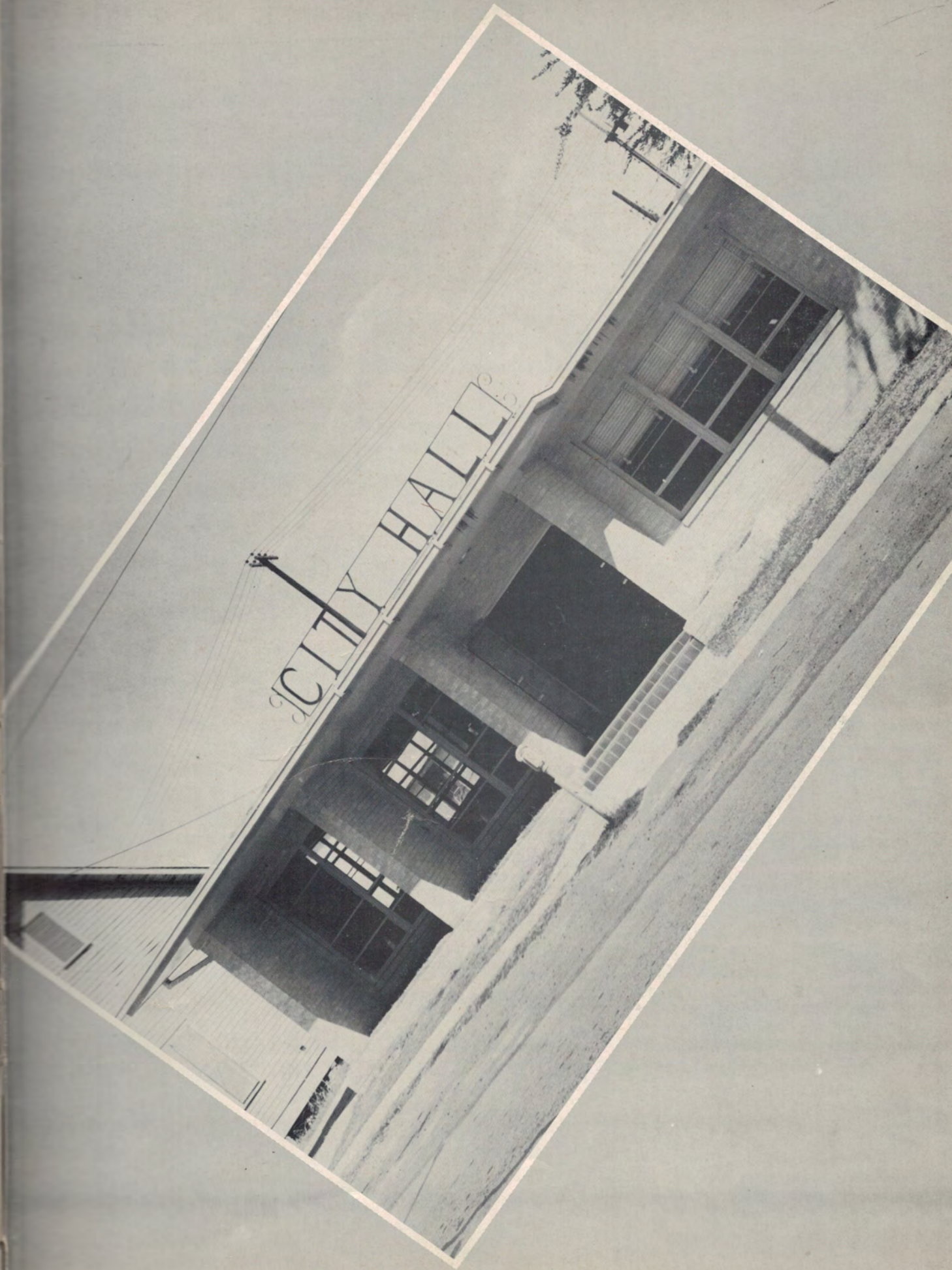

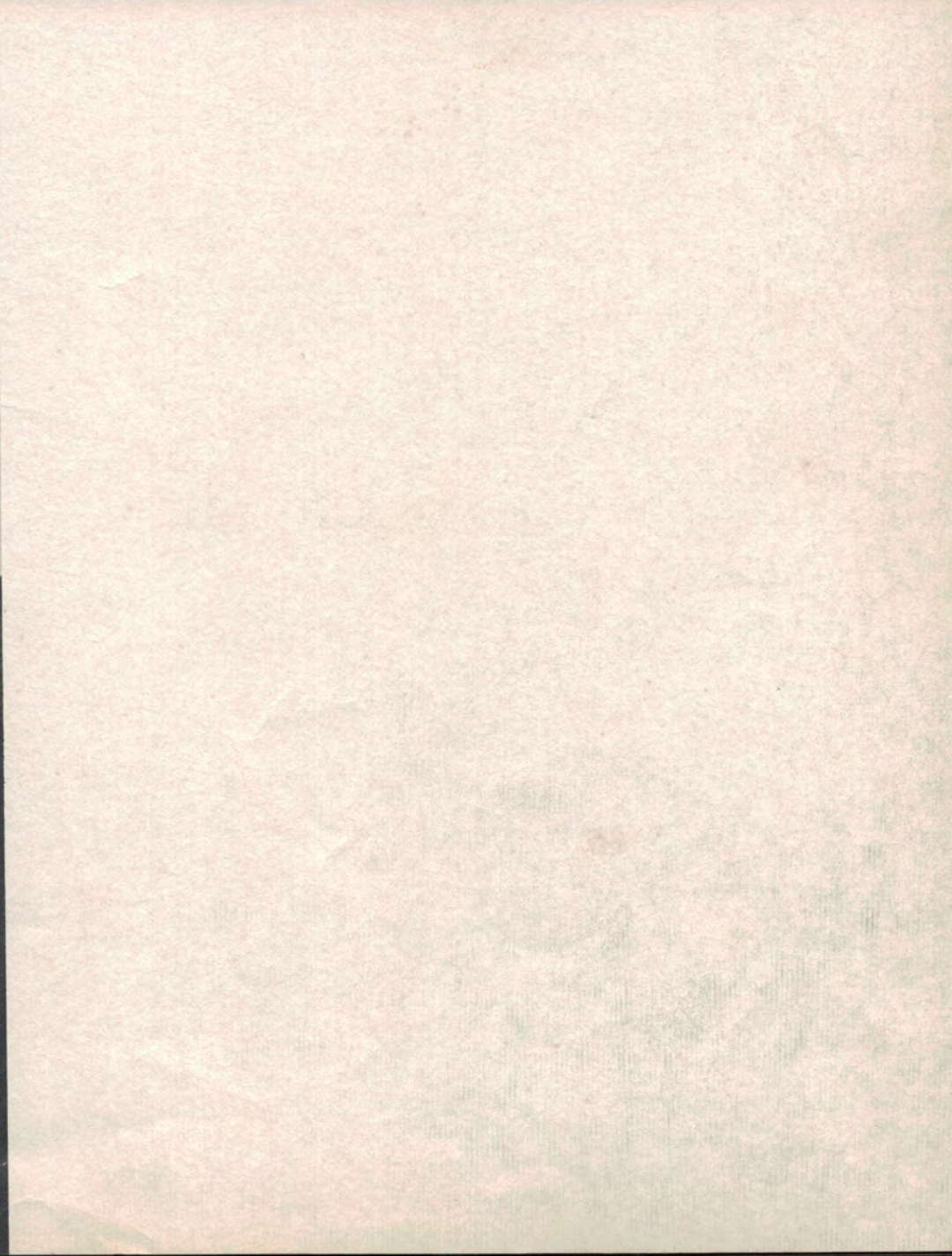

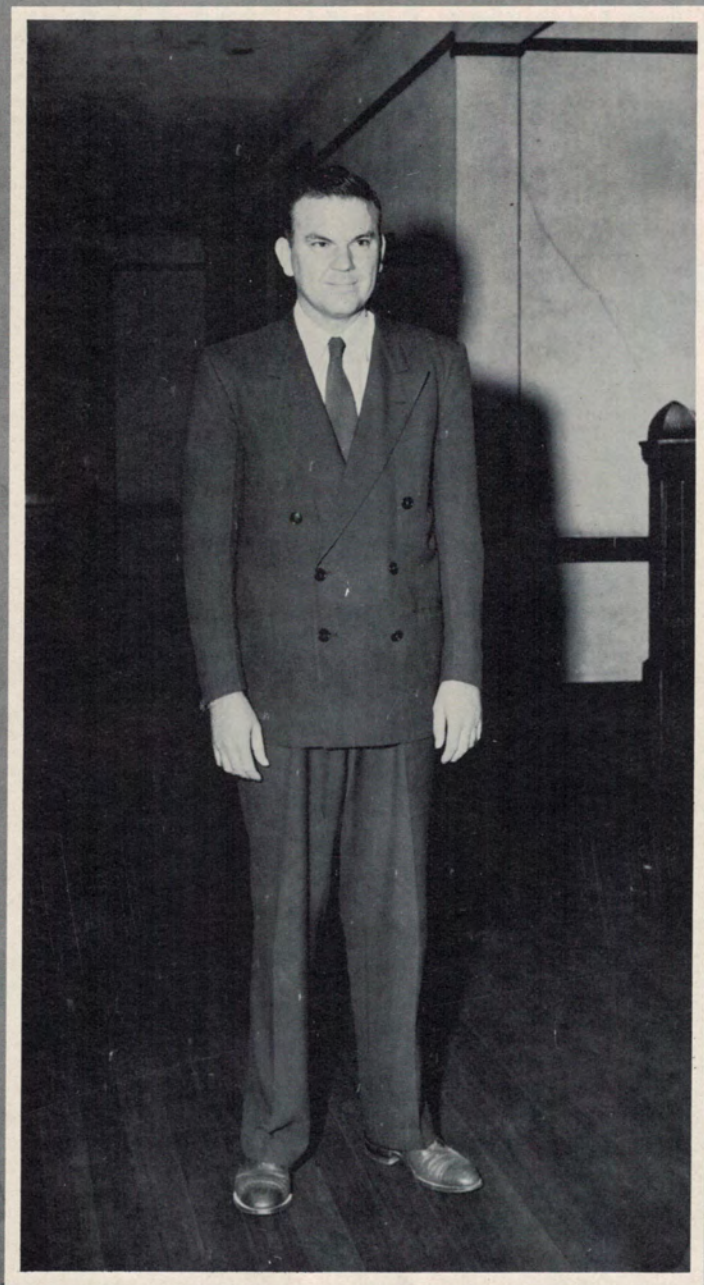

Mr. George Frank, English teacher, and Mr. Marvin Tanner, Librarian, complete our list of old teachers.

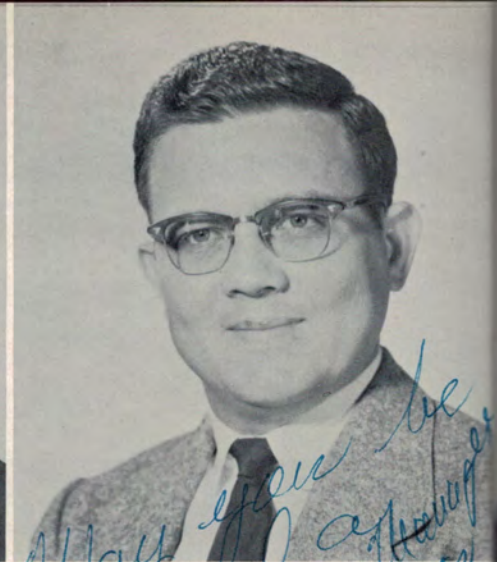

In our second year in Class "A" football the Panthers lost only to Oakdale in district play. The transition the players made from the familiar single

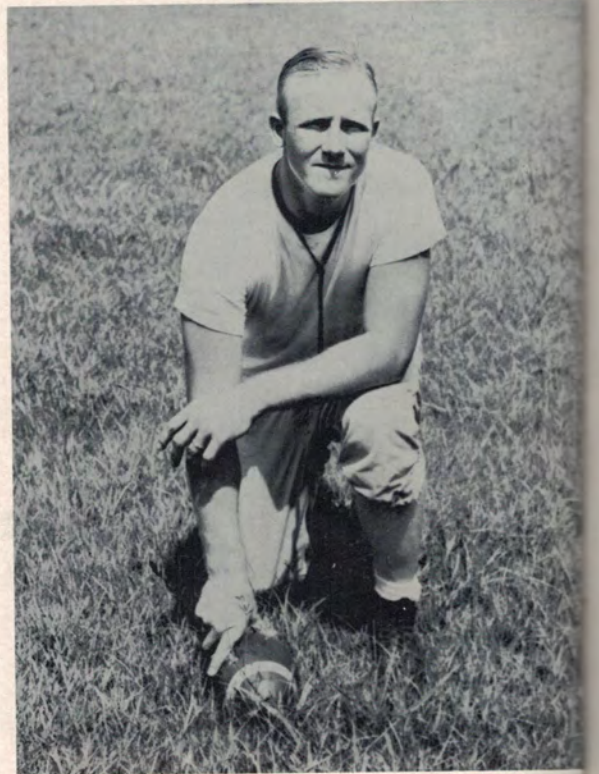

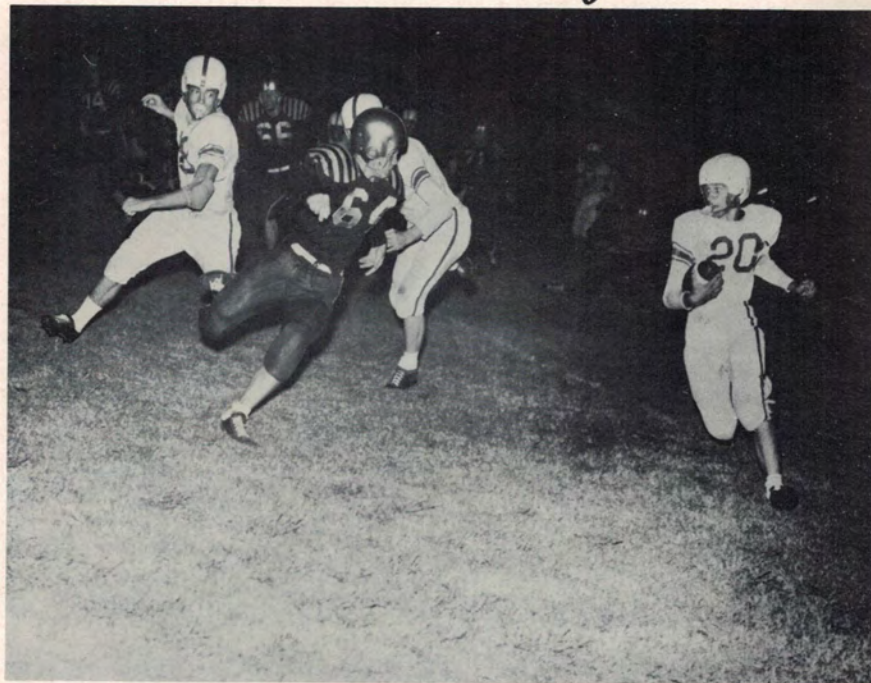
Panthers vs Oberlin

Panthers vs Marksville

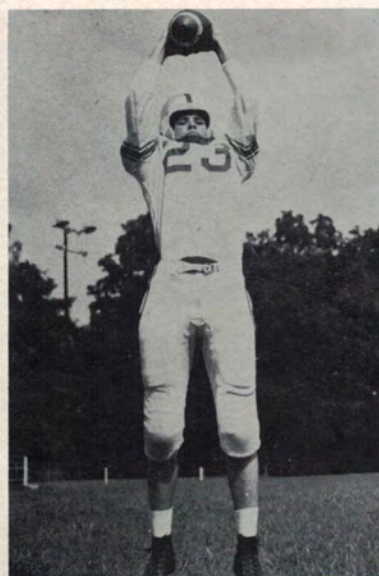
