The First Schools

- First school in area was a one room cabin on the Parker homestead (Heather Park area now)
- First school in actual town of Vernonia was on hill where Stony Point Road joins Keasey Road



FIRST Washington School

- Elementary school plus some high school age students. For formal high school education, students had to board at schools in the valley.
- When it was torn down, the materials were salvaged by members of the Natal Grange to build their hall.

Washington Grade School

- Built in 1930. Original budget was \$75,000 but final cost was \$90,000.
- Half of the students in Vernonia attended WGS, the others went to Lincoln.
- Vernonia High School was built in 1922 on A Street with financial support from Oregon American Lumber Company.
- The "new" high school was built in 1952.


