Dear Parishioners,

Happy Epiphany!

In the United States, the Feast of the Epiphany has been moved from the traditional Twelfth Day of Christmas, January 6, to the Sunday that falls between January 2 and 9. While this change has practical reasons, it can unfortunately obscure the meaning of the Twelve Days of Christmas, leading some to think they refer to the twelve days before Christmas. In reality, Advent—and even the O Antiphons beginning on December 17—serve as the Church’s true countdown to Christmas.

Epiphany marks three great revelations. We most commonly associate it with the arrival of the Wise Men (Magi), but it also includes the Baptism of the Lord (which we celebrate next week) and Jesus’ first miracle at the wedding feast of Cana, where He turned water into wine. These events are united by the meaning of the word Epiphany, which means revelation.

In these moments:

- Jesus is revealed as King, worthy of gold and homage from the Magi.
- He is revealed as Savior, identifying Himself fully with humanity in His baptism.
- He is revealed as God made man, manifesting His divine power through His first miracle.

Each event proclaims who Jesus truly is.

Still, today we focus especially on the visit of the Wise Men. There is much to ponder here. The star itself proclaims that God set the heavens in motion to announce the birth of the newborn King. The gifts—gold, frankincense, and myrrh—proclaim Jesus as King, God, and a suffering Savior. The Magi, however many they were, recognized that ancient prophecies were being fulfilled and set out to offer Him homage.

They did not remain safely in their libraries or studies; they went in search of Christ. In doing so, they show us what we are called to do as well: to reflect on who this Child born for us truly is—and to ask ourselves what gift we will bring Him.



The Twelve Days of Christmas

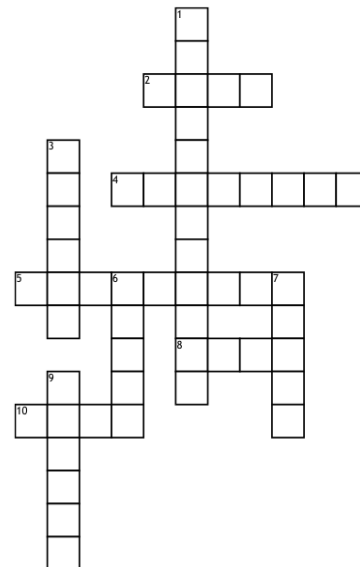
It has been suggested that this old French Christmas Carol was written to help teach children the catechism. There is no historical evidence that this is true, and the Catholic Church does not believe it to be true.

Supposedly, the “True Love” refers to God and “me” is every Christian. Each verse was thought to symbolize Christian beliefs. They are listed below:

The Song's Allegorical Meaning

- **1 Partridge in a Pear Tree:** Jesus Christ.
- **2 Turtle Doves:** Old & New Testaments.
- **3 French Hens:** Faith, Hope, Charity.
- **4 Calling Birds:** Four Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, John).
- **5 Golden Rings:** First Five Books of the Old Testament (Pentateuch).
- **6 Geese A-laying:** Six Days of Creation.
- **7 Swans A-swimming:** Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit. (Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, and Fear of God)
- **8 Maids A-milking:** The Eight Beatitudes.
- **9 Ladies Dancing:** Nine Fruits of the Holy Spirit. (Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self-control)
- **10 Lords A-leaping:** Ten Commandments.
- **11 Pipers Piping:** Eleven Faithful Apostles.
- **12 Drummers Drumming:** Twelve Points of the Apostle's Creed.
