Application Process

The Sterling Board of Education has engaged the services of the Connecticut Association of Boards of Education (CABE) Search Services to conduct its search for qualified candidates. The screening process is ongoing. All applicants must provide the following by the **JUNE 3, 2022 DEADLINE**:

- A CABE Search Services application (<u>cabe.org</u>, services, search services, application)
- A current resume
- A cover letter including highlights of key professional accomplishments and explanation of how these will contribute to your success as Superintendent
- ♦ A minimum of three recent letters of professional reference
- Undergraduate and graduate transcripts
- A copy of professional certification

A historically significant town along the Rhode Island border in Windham County, Sterling was once a stagecoach route between New London and Providence frequented by General Rochambeau and George Washington.
