HOUSTON COUNTY, GA – Louis Leskosky, the Gifted Lead Teacher at Warner Robins High School, was selected as the Outstanding Teacher of American History by the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) Sukey Hart Chapter, the local Warner Robins Chapter. Mr. Leskosky was also chosen as the Georgia State Society winner by the DAR for the same category. Leskosky has taught Advanced Placement US Government for the past 13 years.

Included in one of the letters of recommendation for the award, former student Audrey Westray shared her thoughts about Mr. Leskosky. "He is never reluctant to take time out of his day to help students outside of class and offers after school study sessions to his students. His classroom, lovingly referred to as
